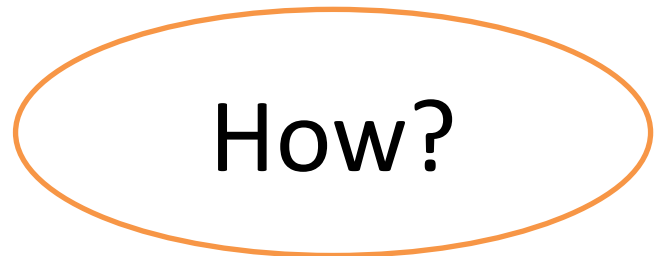

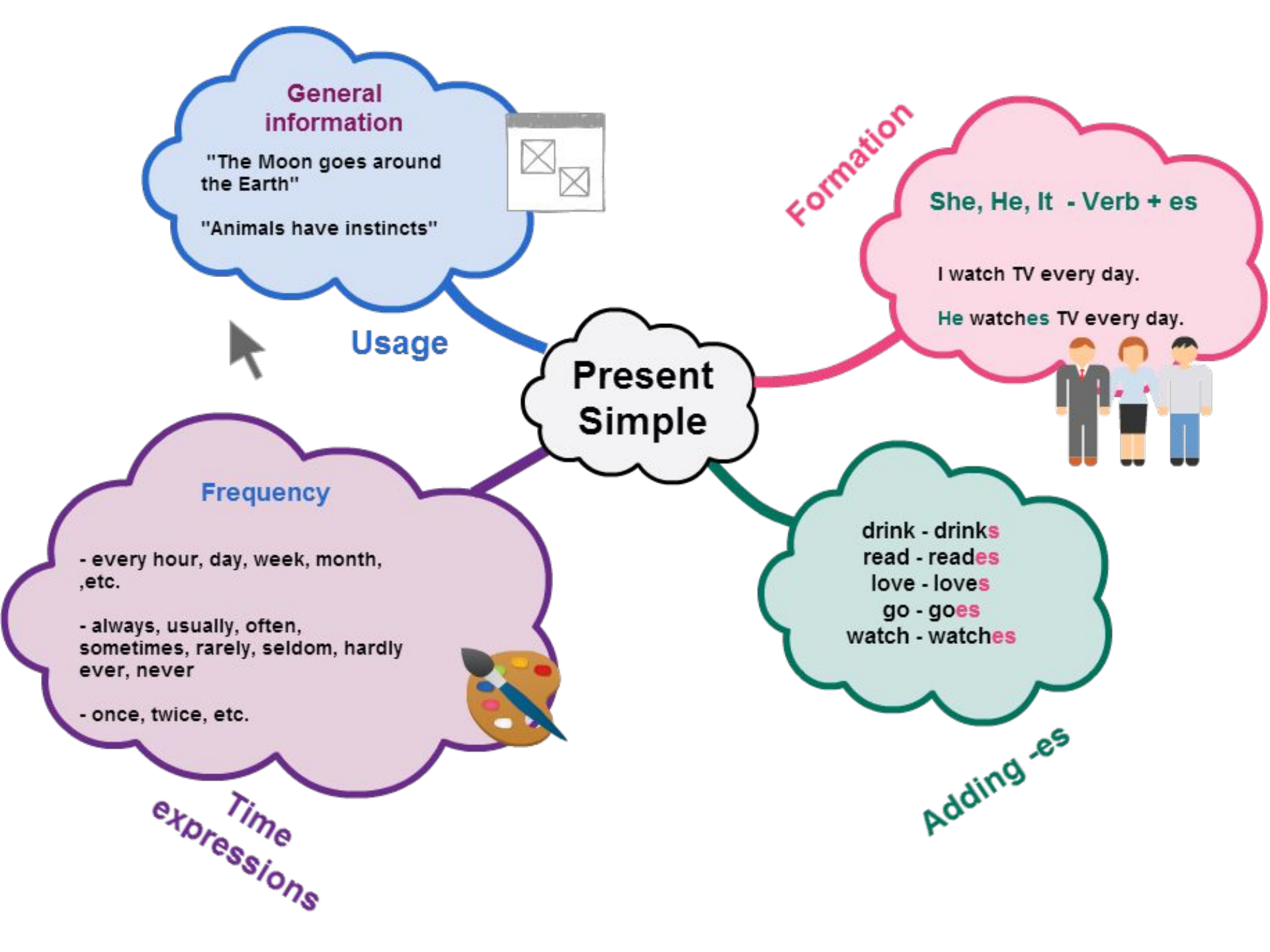

Usage

Present Simple

Formation

She, He, It - Verb + es

I watch TV every day.

He watches TV every day.



Frequency

- every hour, day, week, month, etc.

- always, usually, often, sometimes, rarely, seldom, hardly ever, never

- once, twice, etc.



Time expressions

drink - drink**s**
read - read**es**
love - love**s**
go - go**es**
watch - watch**es**

Adding -es

THE PRESENT SIMPLE

AFFIRMATIVE

Verbs ending in:

- -ch
- -sh
- -x
- -ss
- -o

+ -es

• consonant + y

We **work** in an office

You **work** in an office

They **work** in an office



ATTENTION

SPECIAL CASES

He **watches** television.

He **washes** the dishes.

She **fixes** radios.

He **misses** his girlfriend.

She **goes** to school.

She **does** his homework.

He **studies** English.



I play tennis on Monday/on Mondays.



I make my homework every day.



I play computer on Monday.



I read tales every Tuesday.

I study every day.



I take photos on Sundays.



I play football once a week.

Simple Present Tense

★ This tense has only **one word**.

e.g.



❖ Candy **likes** flowers.

❖ The flowers **smell** good.

❖ Mimi **sings** well.

❖ Mimi **is** good at singing.

e.g.



What have you arranged for tonight? — What are you doing tonight?
 I have an appointment with my dentist. — I am going to the dentist tomorrow.

Two or more people have arranged something for the future

He is on the pitch now. — He is playing football.
 I am on my way now. — I am going to the dentist.

Something is happening NOW



do - doing
 read - reading
 play - playing
 work - working

VERB + ing

have - having
 shave - shaving
 share - sharing
 take - taking

-e NO -e + ing

die - dying
 lie - lying

-ie changes to y + ing



She is not playing tennis.
 She is playing football.

get - getting
 stop - stopping
 run - running

One syllable ends with 1 vowel and 1 consonant double the last consonant

Usage

Affirmative +

I	am	doing
He / She / It / Jane	is	doing
We / They / David and John	are	doing

Present continuous

Negative -

I	am not	doing
He / She / It / Jane	is not isn't	doing
We / They / David and John	are not	doing

Question ?

What	am	I	doing
Where	is	he / she / it / Jane	doing
Why	are	we / they / David and John	doing

Simple present

VS

Present continuous

I walk to school.

I'm walking to school.

I walk to school every day.



I'm walking to school now.



I play tennis four times a week.



I'm playing tennis.

Sub. + verb 1

- talk about routines
- show how often something happens

Sub. + is/am/are + v.ing

- talk about an action that is happening at the time of speaking

Compare!

This is strange! Eunice gets up at 7 o'clock. It's 8 o'clock now and she's sleeping!

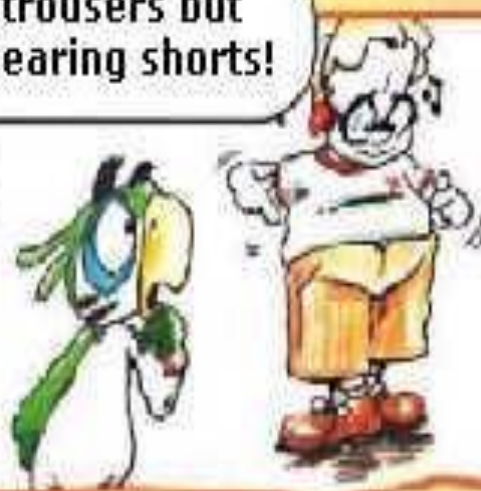
