



# **Compound sentences**

**Compound sentence** is a sentence that contains two clauses or complete ideas that are related. These two clauses are usually connected in a compound sentence by a conjunction

**Interconnected by the writing unions:**  
and, or, no, no, not yet, but others.

**For example:** Now we have different kinds of compasses , **and** we use them not only innavigation but in aircraft as well.

A compound sentence consists of simple, grammatically independent sentences related to each other.

**without connection:**

**For examples:** He turned the lever to the right , the motor started .

*Simple sentences as part of an asyndetic compound sentence are separated from each other by a semicolon or comma.*

A compound sentence consists of simple, grammatically independent sentences connected to each other:

**Related allied adverbs:** otherwise, however, nevertheless, yet, still, etc.

**For examples:** Engines must be lubricated systematically ,  
otherwisi they may be damaged.
