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Characteristics

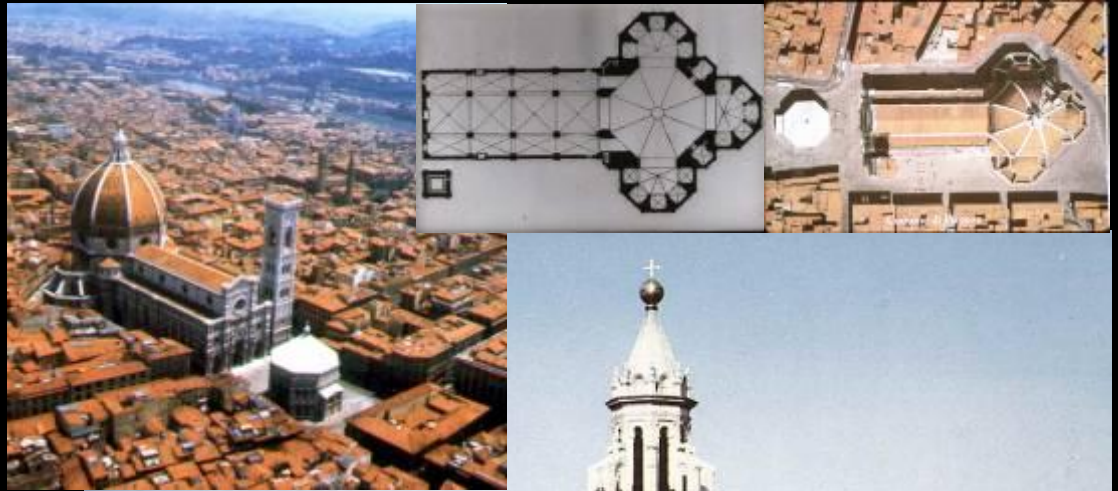
- Based on proportion
- Symmetry
- The sizes, the walls and so on are following the proportions of a person
- More profane than sacral, so palaces
- Central plan, mainly in churches
- Perfect forms
- Respect for antiquity, the model: ancient times
- Dome
- Not individual, always respect for environment

Ideal space: central plan (Leon Battista Alberti)

- Loggia



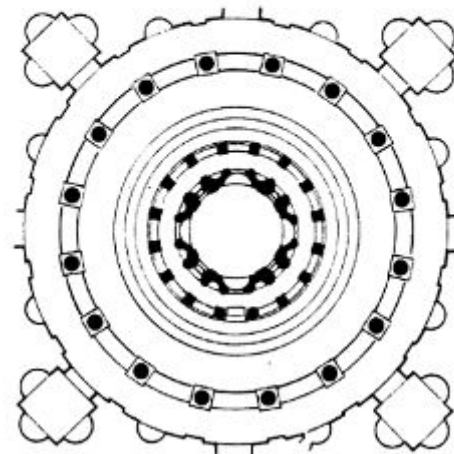
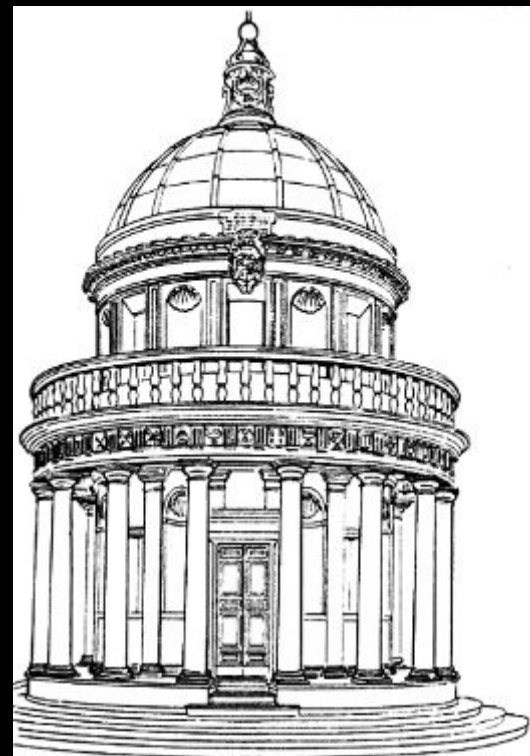


Palazzi: profane buildings, palaces,

- The place where was Saint Peter crucified upside down
- It is the place where the first pope (Peter) died, so it has a meaning! The basicila is for his tomb
