AS IF \ AS THOUGH

The past perfect subjunctive after *as if / as though* is used to refer to an unreal past situation:
It looks as if they've had a shock.
ПОХОЖЕ, ОНИ ПЕРЕЖИЛИ ШОК



*She felt **as if** all her worries had gone.*



*They felt **as though** they had been given the wrong information.*

*He seems as if he **hadn't slept** for days. (but we don't know)*




Even if - refers to a hypothetical or unreal situation.

"Even if I invited her, she wouldn't come" – (you didn't really invite her and we are not a 100% sure she won't come).

Even though – smth definitely happening:
Even though the interview went bad. He got the job.
