One syllable adjectives, add -er at the end of the adjective. The Amazon river is longer than the Mississippi river.

If an adjective has one syllable and ends in "e" just add -r. The baby koala is cuter than the baby turtle.



BRAVE-----BRAVER

LARGE-----LARGER

RUDE-----RUDER

SAFE-----SAFER

HAPPY

Adjectives that end in Y preceded by a consonant just eliminate Y and add –er at the end. The baby is happier than the woman.





BUSY-----BUSIER

DIRTY-----DIRT ER

COZY-----COZ ER

PRETTY-----PRETT ER

LAZY----- LAZER

HOT

One syllable adjectives that end in consonant. Double the last consonant and add -er. The sun is hotter than fire.





FAT----- FAT ER

BIG-----BIGGER

THIN-----THINNER

SAD-----SAD ER

BEAUTIFUL

Adjectives with more than two syllables add more before the adjective to compare.

A rainbow is more beautiful than the rain.
