QUESTION TAGS



Question tags are short questions that can follow sentences, especially in spoken English.

• We use question tags to ask if something is true or to ask people to agree with us.



FORM

- Positive statement question tag negative
- Negative statement question tag positive EXAMPLES
- □ With the verb <u>to be</u>
 - You are a teacher, aren't you?
 - She is beautiful, isn't she?
- \square NB the short form with I am is <u>aren't I</u>
 - I'm late, aren't I?

With the verb <u>to have</u>
You've got a dog, haven't you?
He hasn't lost his key, has he?

With <u>other verbs (do, don't, did, didn't etc.)</u>
They don't play football, do they?
They went to the cinema yesterday,
didn't they?

With <u>modal verbs</u>
They can drive, can't they?
You won't lie to me, will you?


Exception: <u>Let's</u> is followed by <u>shall we</u> Let's go for a walk, shall we?




