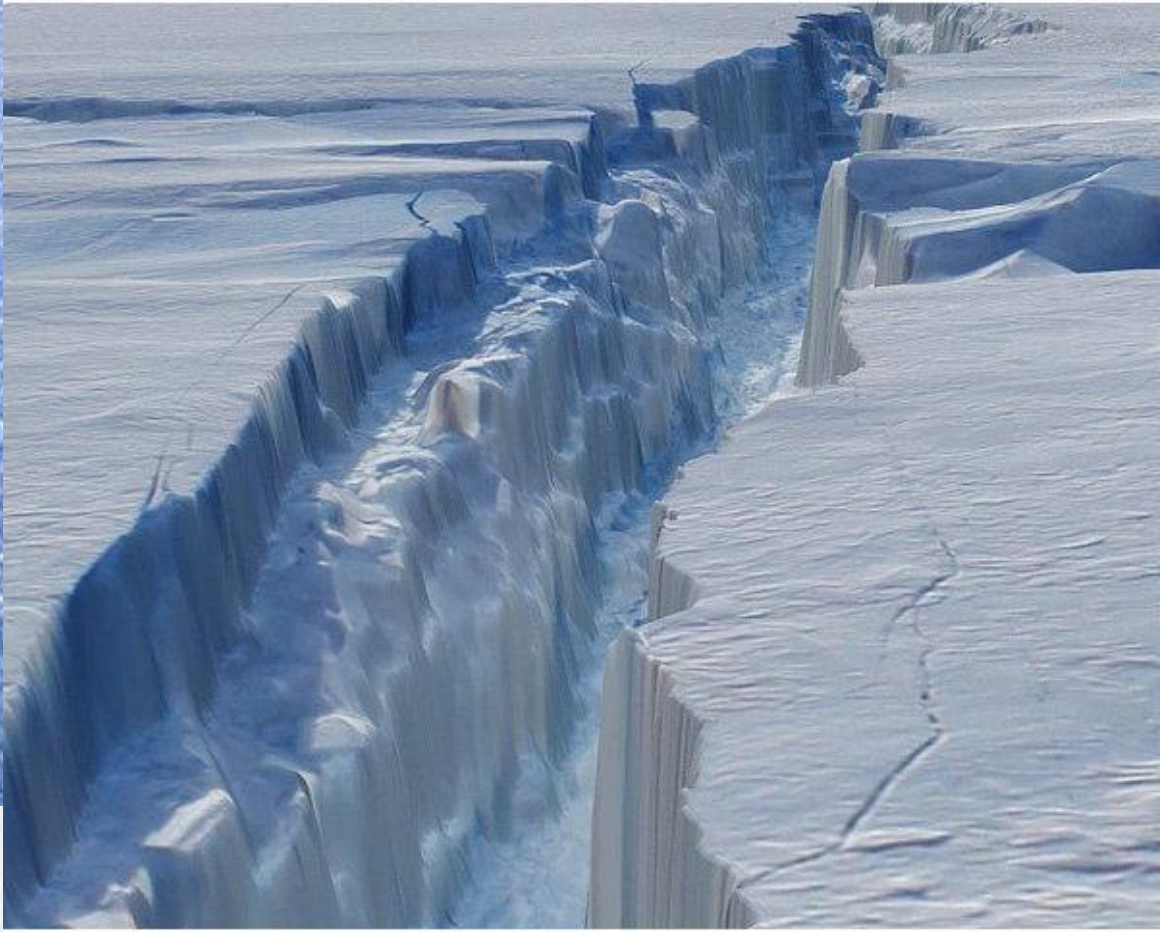

Antarctica is the Earth's most southern continent located at the South Pole.



About 98 percent of Antarctica
is covered by ice.



- There are no trees or bushes that grow in the Antarctic, only moss and algae.



- Whales, seals and birds live in the waters and coastal areas of the Antarctic.



- Penguins are the most famous inhabitants of the Antarctic.



- These birds can't fly and live on the ice sheets and coastal waters.



Global warming and pollution are threatening this precious ecosystem.





- Before the 1960s there was no regulation or protection of Antarctica.





- The Antarctic treaty now protects all the animals and plants there and prohibits pollution in the area.



- Pollution of the sea is prohibited and no Antarctic animal can be captured or hunted. .





- Special permits are given to visit the area to those that are approved by the treaty.
