About 98 percent of Antarctica is covered by ice.






• There are no trees or bushes that grow in the Antarctic, only moss and algae.

• Penguins are the most famous inhabitants of the Antarctic.




• These birds can't fly and live on the ice sheets and coastal waters.

• Special permits are given to visit the area to those that are approved by the treaty.
