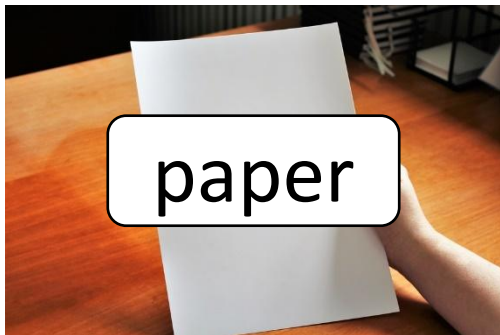
Plants growing together near water.

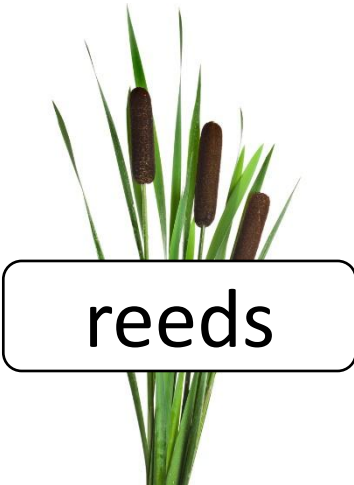

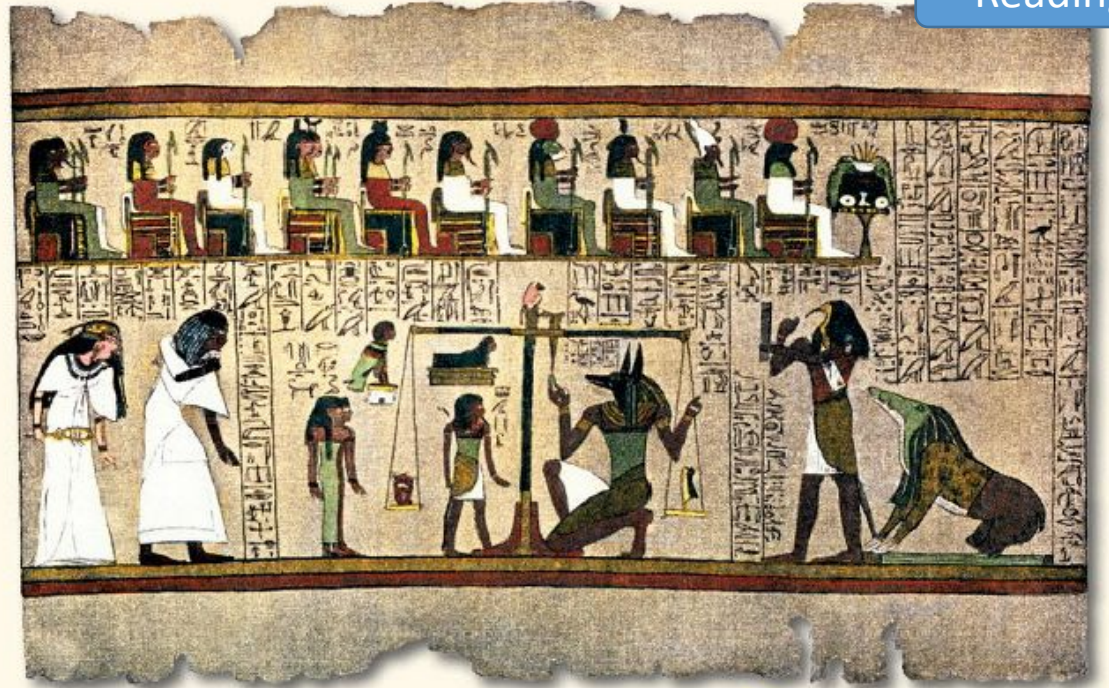

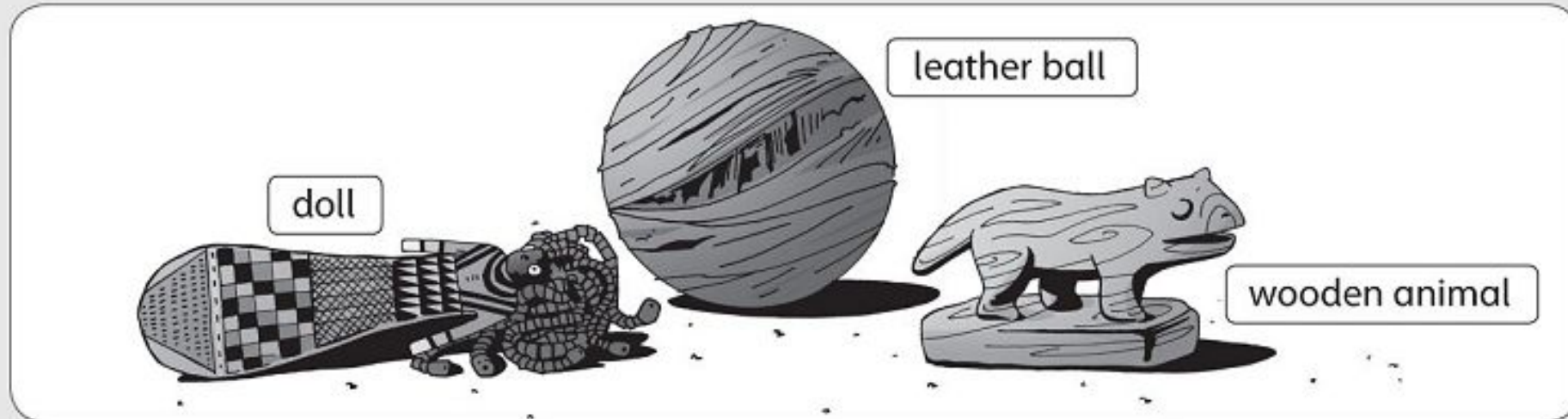
