Step 1. Project concept

- Our group decided to create a website, dedicated to the students of our university. There, they will be able to propose their ideas of special events for other students, e.g. sport or cybersport tournaments, art competitions, etc.
- This is how it will work: a student fills out a request for creating an event on the website. Then, if it's a relatively large event, it must get a certain amount of votes in order to be approved by the university, which, then, provides participants with a place where the event will be held. If, however, suggested event is just a friendly match, involving small amount of participants, it only needs to be reviewed by the administration of the website.

Step 2. Planning stage

- At the start our team will create a design of the website. This involves making a layout for pages on the website and deciding on such things as a style, a size and a colour of the fonts which will be used on the pages.



Step 3. Development

- Two people from the group will start to code the site, while the other three will write content with which the pages will be filled. This will take approximately 2 weeks, 3 hour per day.
- Then, with the help of the university, the complete website will get a VDS-hosting, with a DDoS protection and a good performance, which will cost approximately 700 rubles a month.



Step 4. Advertisement

- To let everyone know about the website we are going to make a video on YouTube in which we will demonstrate how it will work in general and some of its features. Also, we will make a post in the group of the university on VK.
- At the beginning a series of show tournaments will be held in order to promote the website.
