THE LIBERAL DEMOCRATS



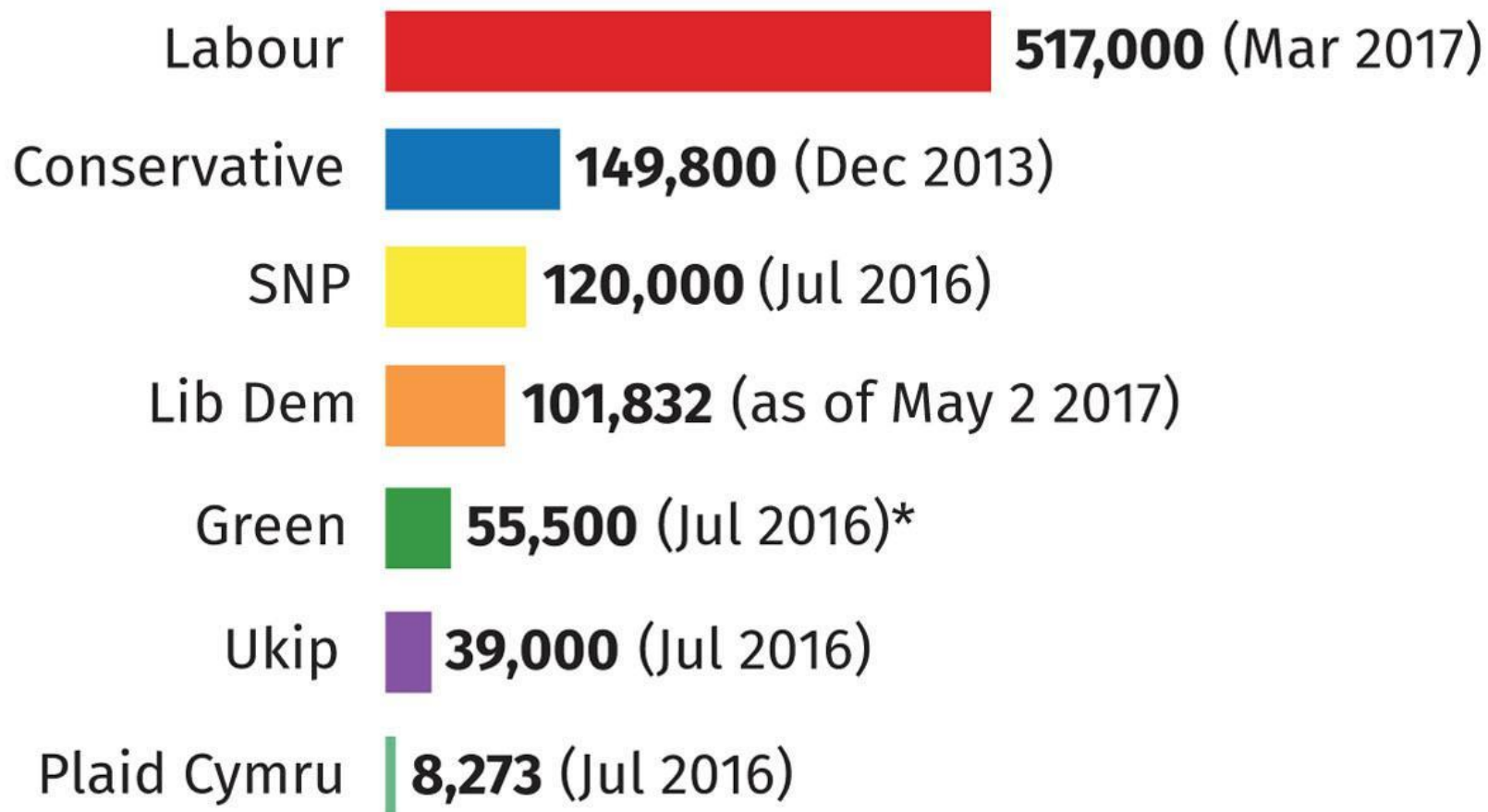
- Formed in the late 1980s
