

Some people believe that children and teenagers shouldn't get homework. They think that they should do all their learning in school.



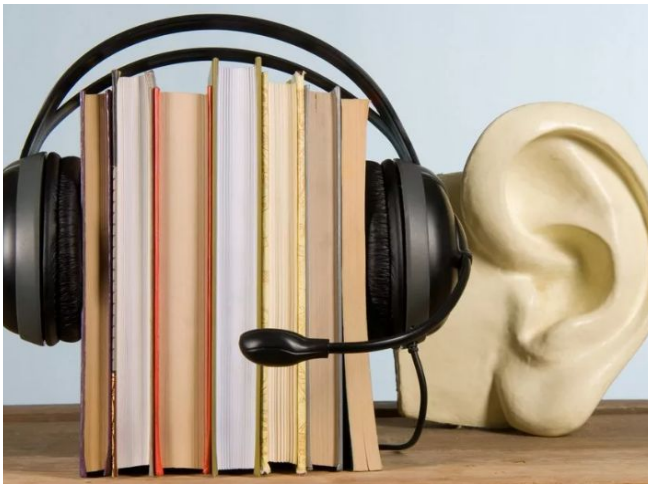

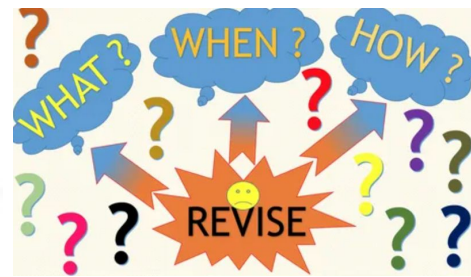
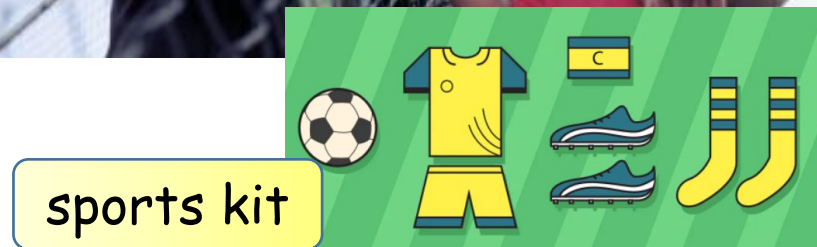

## Present Simple

I go, we go, he goes, she goes, it is, that is, can, need to, have to and so on.

## Present Continuous

I am going, she is going, he is going, it is going, we are going, they are going...

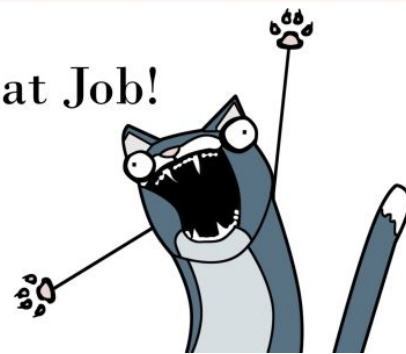

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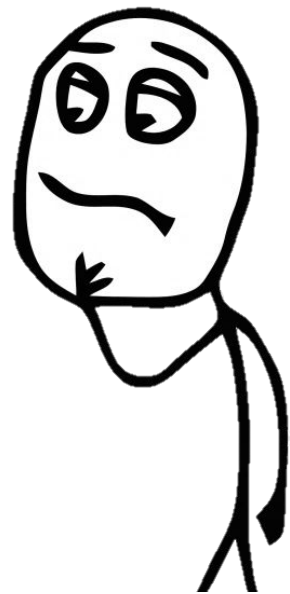
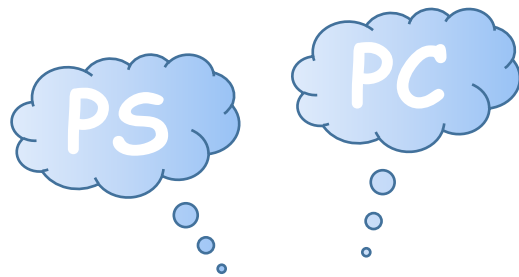

They describe a state, not an action, and they are used in the present simple. We do not normally use them in the present continuous.

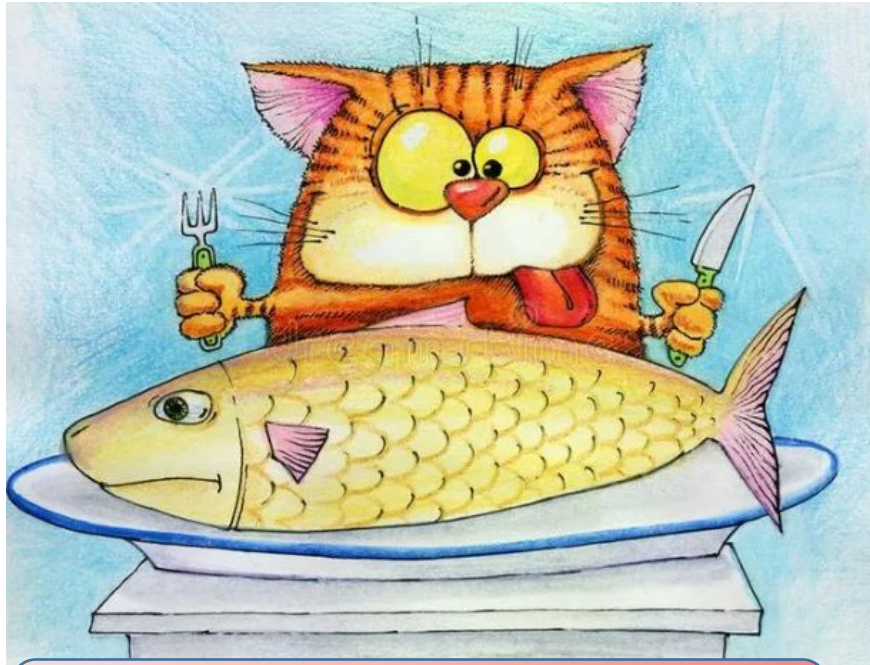

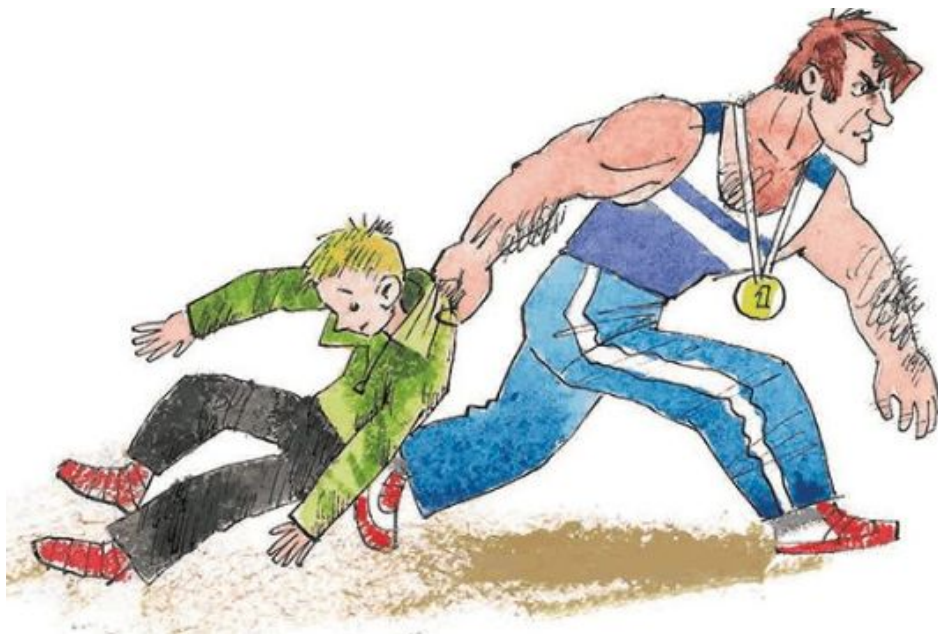
