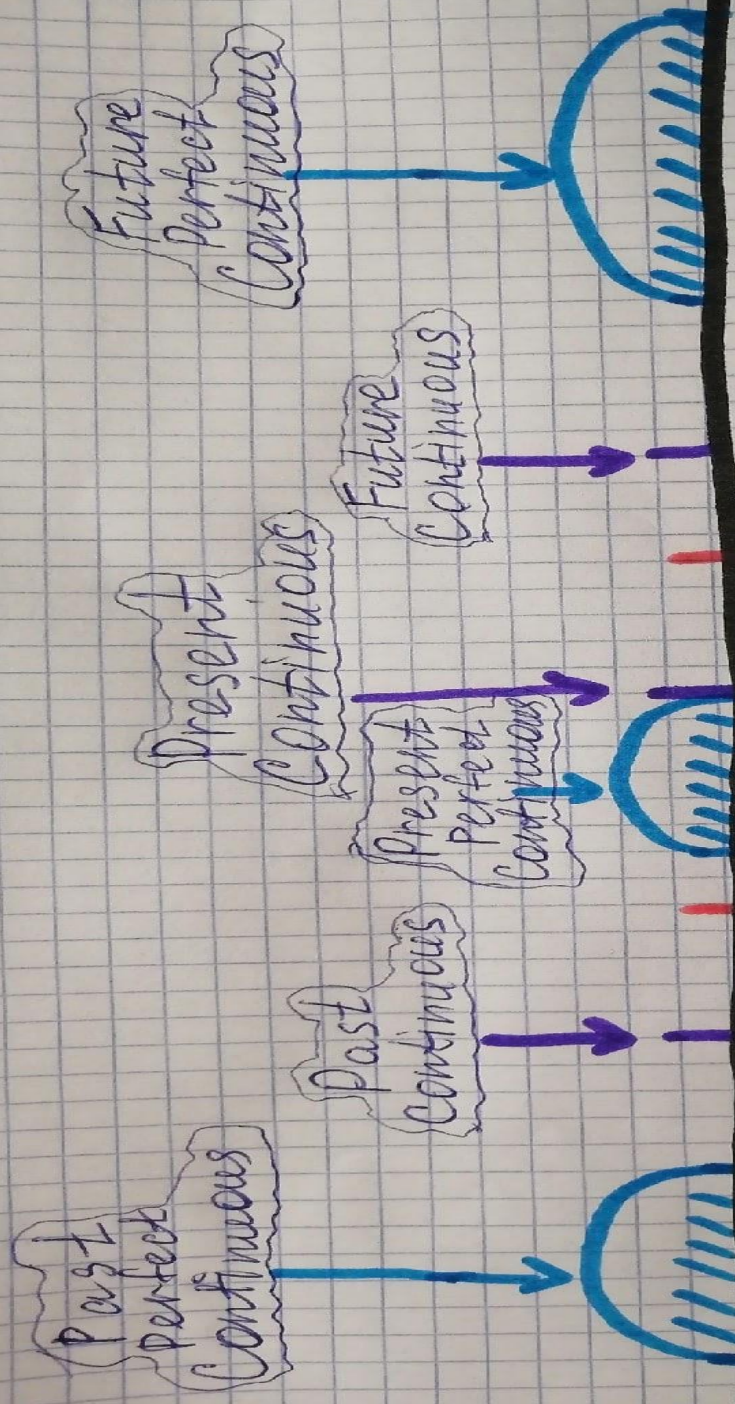

Present Simple

- **Simple** – факт, одноразовое или повторяющееся действие. Мы примерно знаем, когда оно произошло/произойдет.
- **Continuous** – процесс, которые происходит/происходил/будет происходить в определенный момент в прошлом, сейчас, в будущем, и мы точно знаем, в какой. (предлог «В»)
- **Perfect** – результат какого-то действия к определенному моменту в прошлом, к настоящему моменту или к моменту в будущем. (предлог «К»)
- **Perfect Continuous** – действие/процесс, и мы знаем, с какого и до какого момента он длился, длится или будет длиться. (предлоги «с – до»)
