Greetings

Hello

Nice to see you.

Good morning (morning)

Good afternoon (afternoon)

Good evening (evening)

Describing yourself

- Do you know Michael?
- Have you meet George?
- Let me introduce my wife.
- Let me introduce you to Dr. Samuel Hemmigton.
- Mark, this is Michael, my math Teacher.
- I don't think you know Mary. Mary this is Alex.



Verb to be: present simple

Am, is, are

TO BE Simple Present Tense



AFFIRMATIVE

NEGATIVE

SINGULAR

I **am** happy.
 You **are** at school.
 He **is** hungry.
 She **is** a nurse.
 It **is** big.

I **am not** sad.
 You **aren't** at home.
 He **isn't** thirsty.
 She **isn't** a pilot.
 It **isn't** small.

Contraction of "am not" is not possible
~~amn't~~

isn't = is not

PLURAL

We **are** early.
 You **are** students.
 They **are** quiet.

We **aren't** late.
 You **aren't** teachers.
 They **aren't** noisy.

aren't = are not

QUESTIONS

+ Affirmative They **are** happy. She **is** rich.

? Question **Are** they happy? **Is** she rich?

Short Answer Yes, they are / No, they aren't Yes, she is / No, she isn't

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CONTRACTIONS
