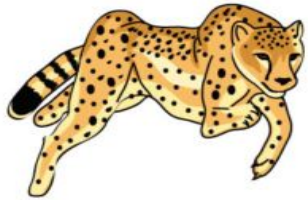

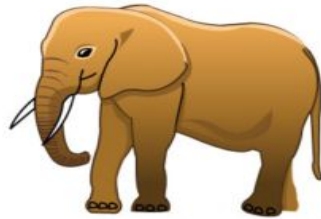

I can recognize and use the present simple forms of the verb **be**.

## Be: present simple affirmative

	Full form	Short form
Singular	I am	I'm
	you are	you're
	he is she is it is	he's she's it's
	we are	we're
Plural	you are	you're
	they are	they're

There are full forms and short forms of the present simple of the verb **be**.

*I am sixteen.*

*I'm sixteen.*

*She is tall.*

*She's tall.*

*They are American.*

*They're American.*

We normally use short forms in conversation and full forms in formal writing.

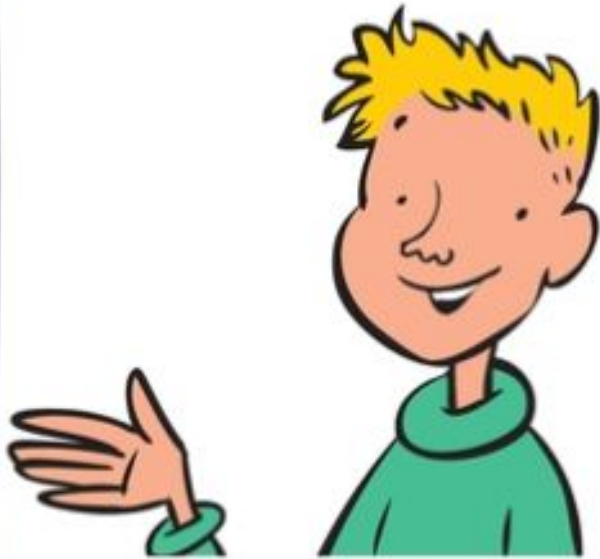

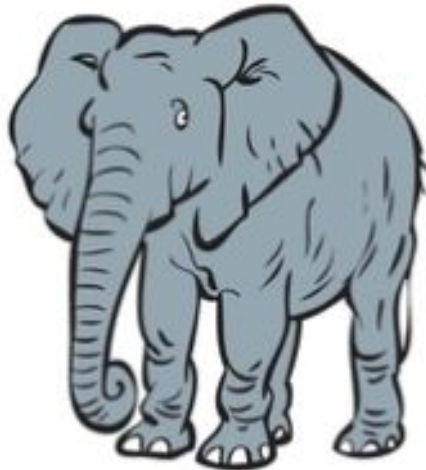

## Be: present simple negative

	Full form	Short form
Singular	I am not	I'm not
	you are not	you aren't
	he is not she is not it is not	he isn't she isn't it isn't
	Plural	we are not
	you are not	you aren't
	they are not	they aren't

Note that the short form for *I* is different from the other short forms.

*I'm not angry.*

*He isn't American. You aren't old.*

## Be: present simple questions

To form questions with the verb **be**, we change the order of the words. We put the verb before the subject.

*Are you happy? Is Lucy British? Are they thirteen?*

Singular	Am I ... ?
	Are you ... ?
	Is he ... ?
	Is she ... ?
	Is it ... ?
Plural	Are we ... ?
	Are you ... ?
	Are they ... ?

When we reply to a question, we often use a short answer.

*Are you Sam? Yes, I am.*

Singular	Yes, I am.	No, I'm not.
	Yes, you are.	No, you aren't.
	Yes, he is.	No, he isn't.
	Yes, she is.	No, she isn't.
	Yes, it is.	No, it isn't.
Plural	Yes, we are.	No, we aren't.
