

The role of the Internet and TV in learning English language



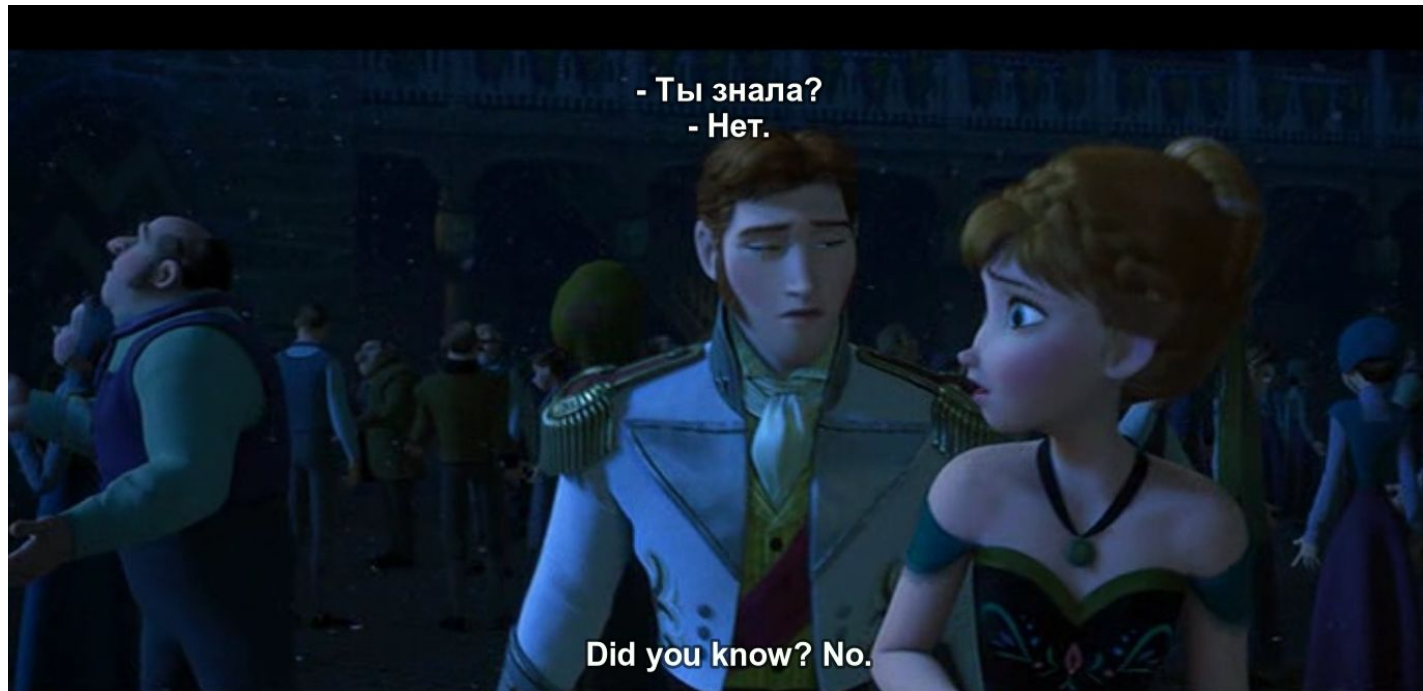
English language is an international language spoken all over the world. To know English is absolutely necessary for every educated person. Today, we can use our computers and TV for learning it.
