

CONC expresses true or very probable situation in the present or future. If + Present Simple, Future Simple operative can/may/might/ must/should + bare infinitive If it is suppy, we will go to the beach. If you need help, ask me. If you do your homework, you can go out. If you go hiking, you must wear hiking boots.

expresses untrue or improbable situations in the present or future. If + Past Simple, would/could/ might + bare infinitive If I had more free time, I would take up gardening. If I won a lot of money in a lottery, I might give some to charity.

I would feel disappointed if Dave <u>didn't invite</u> me to his birthday party.





If my team <u>loses</u> the match, we will fall to the second division.





