### Adjacent

adjoining rooms; adjoining beds; adjoining countries; they descended the hill into the adjoining valley



#### Contiguous

contiguous buildings; the corn-field is contiguous to our garden; a wood contiguous to the plain

# Abutting

facing the square there was the cathedral with its abutting towers

#### Progress

in three hours we hardly progressed at all; 'As we progressed through the woods she made remarks from time to time about the

trees...'

## Advance

we were advancing at a rapid pace; they had advanced a mile; he advanced a few steps to meet me
