PRESENT SIMPLE → PAST SIMPLE

“I **want** to
study
Psychology.”

She said (that)
she **wanted**
to study
Psychology.

PRESENT CONTINUOUS → PAST CONTINUOUS

“We **are
having**
lunch.”

They said
(that) they
were having
lunch.

PRESENT PERFECT → PAST PERFECT

“I **have
cleaned** my
suit.”

She said
(that) she
had cleaned
her suit.

PAST SIMPLE → PAST SIMPLE OR PAST PERFECT

I **did** the
shopping.

He said (that)
she
did/had done
the shopping.

**PAST CONTINUOUS →
PAST PERFECT CONTINUOUS
OR PAST CONTINUOUS**

She **was
reading** a
magazine.

She said
(that) she
**was/had
been
reading**
a magazine

FUTURE SIMPLE → FUTURE IN THE PAST

I **will have** a
party at
7.00.

She said
(that) she
would have
a party at
7.00.

- *THE WEEK BEFORE*
- *THE WEEK AFTER, THE FOLLOWING WEEK*
- *BEFORE*
- *THERE*

REPORTED ORDERS

- **Do your homework!**
- Mom asked me to do my homework.
- **Don't change your tickets!**
- Mom asked me not to change my tickets.

REPORTED QUESTIONS

- **What are you doing?**
- He asked me what I was doing.
- **Are you OK?**
- He asked me if/whether I was OK.

ago...**

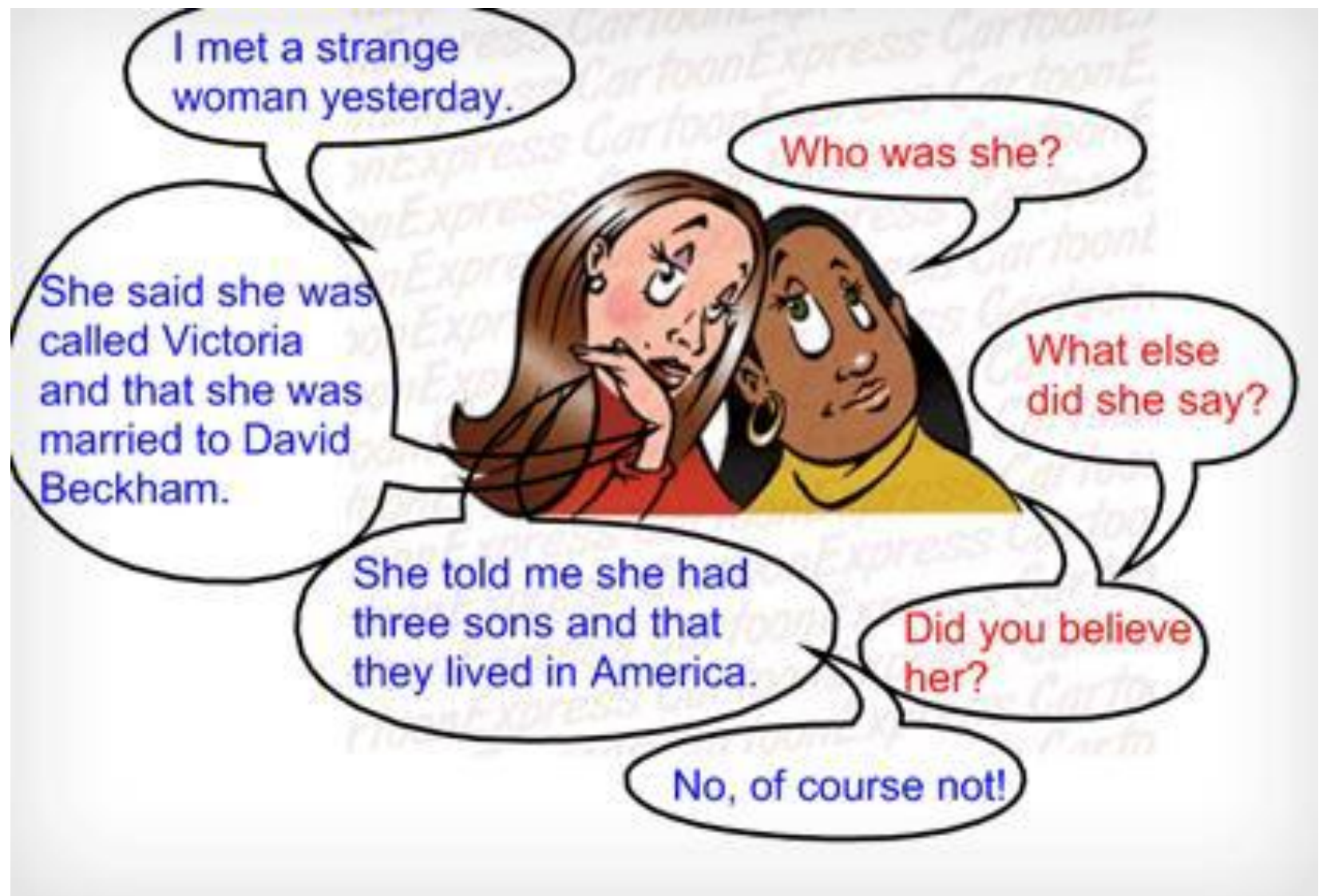


I love Dave.
