Comparative

We use the **comparative** to compare two people or things: *This sculpture is more impressive than that one.*



Superlative

We use the **superlative** to compare one person or thing to more people or things in the same group: *I think he was the greatest singer of all time.*



Irregular forms:

Adjective	Comparative	Superlative
Good/well	better	best
Bad	worse	worst
Much/many	more	most
little	less	least

Note:

Very+**adjective**: *He's very helpful*

Much/a lot/far/a little/a bit/slightly+**comparative**: *The crowd was much larger than last year*
