There is no smoke without fire



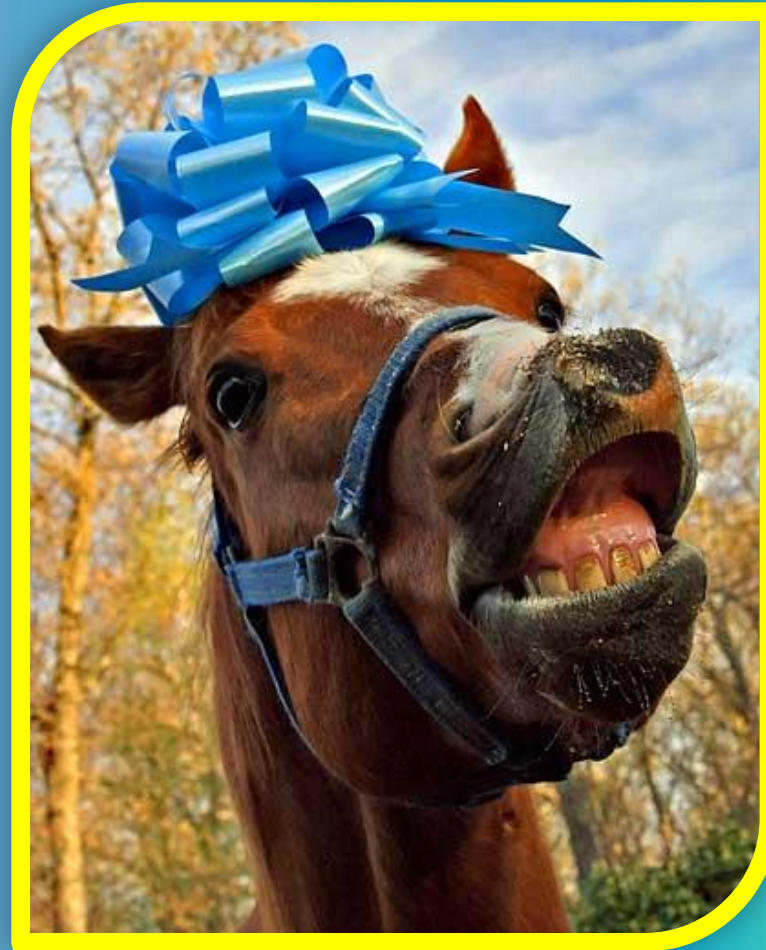
Something that you say which means that if people are saying that someone has done something bad but no one knows whether it is true, it probably is true.

When cat's away, the mice will play



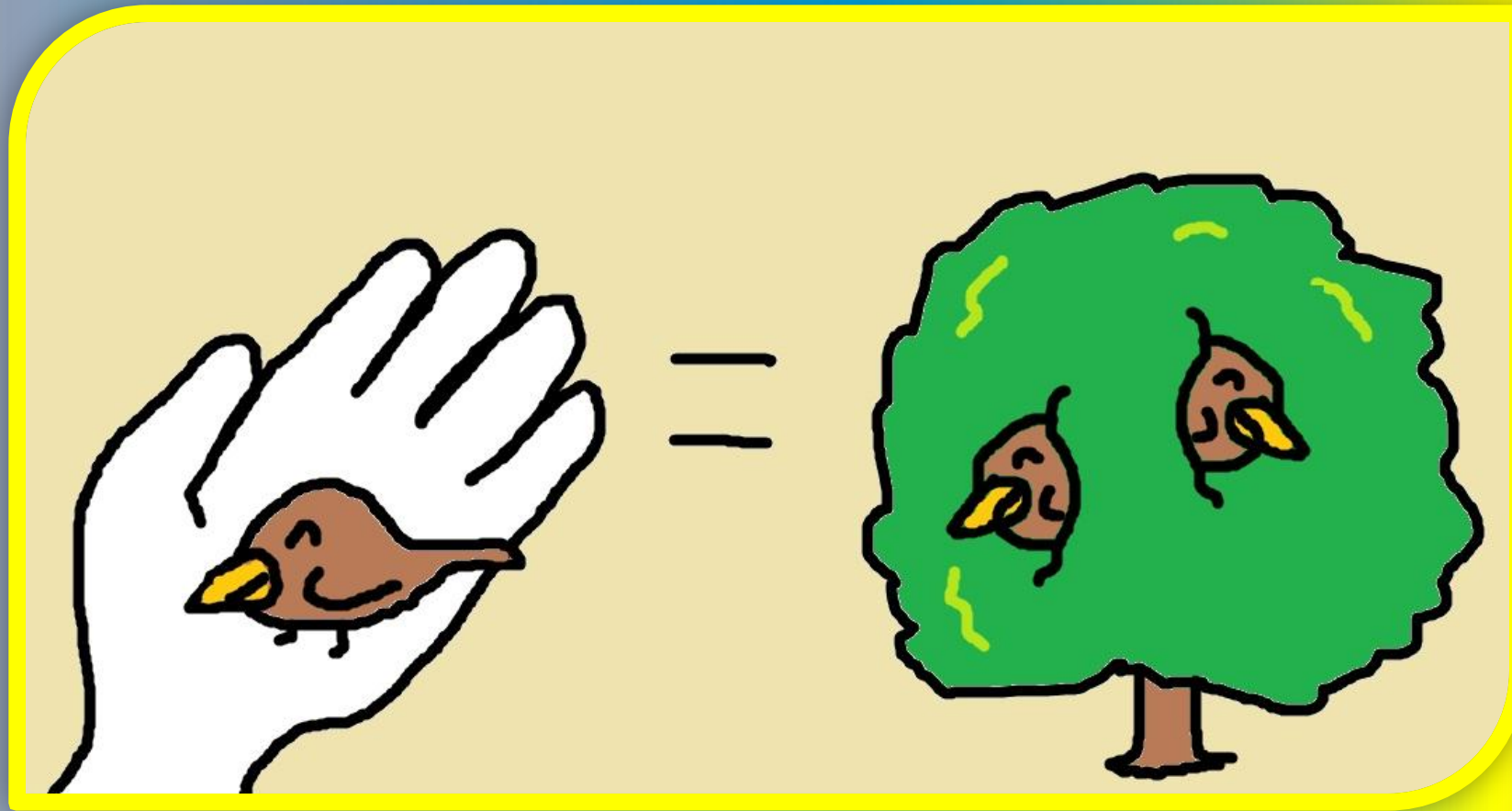
We said when the person who is in charge of a place is not there, and the people there behave badly.

Don't look a gift-horse in the mouth



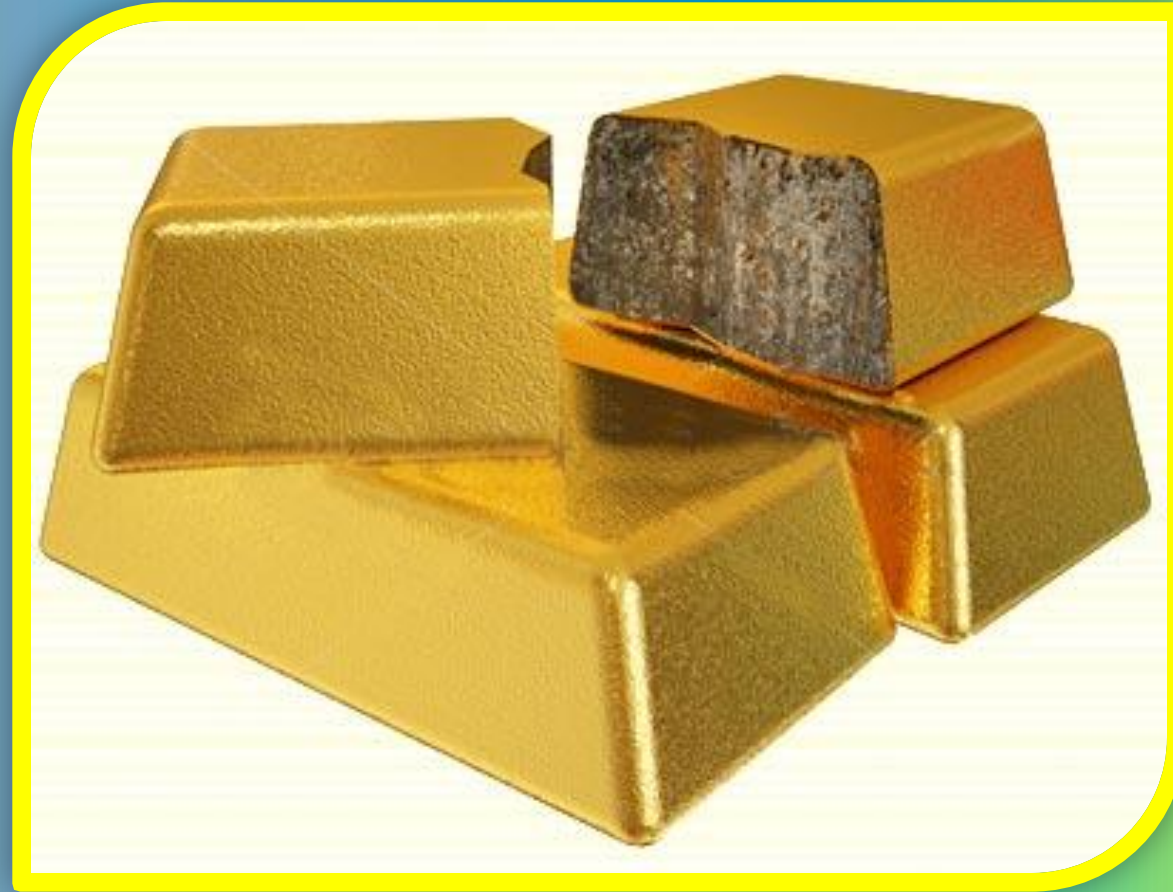
Do not complain if a gift is not perfect; take what you've been given without criticism or emphasis on its worth.

A bird in the hand is worth two in the bush



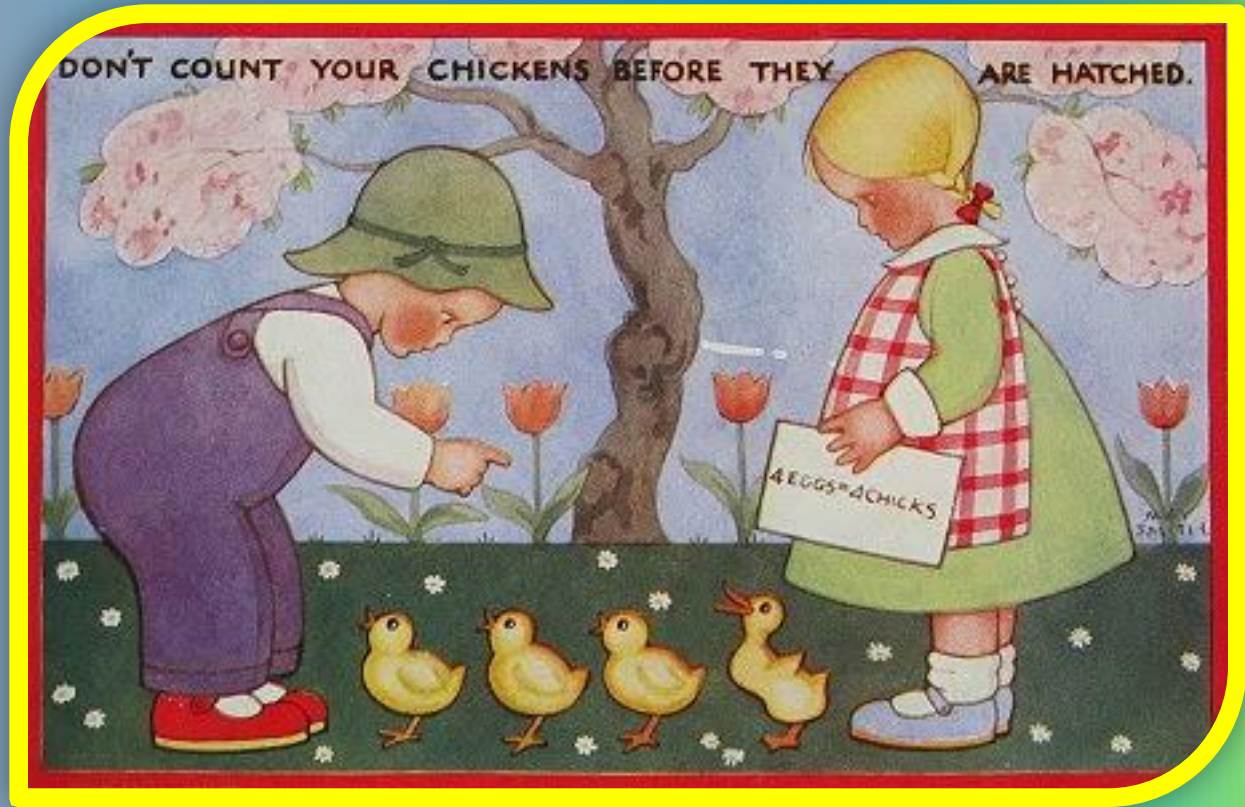
This expression means that it is better to have an advantage or opportunity that is certain than having one that is worth more but is not so certain.
