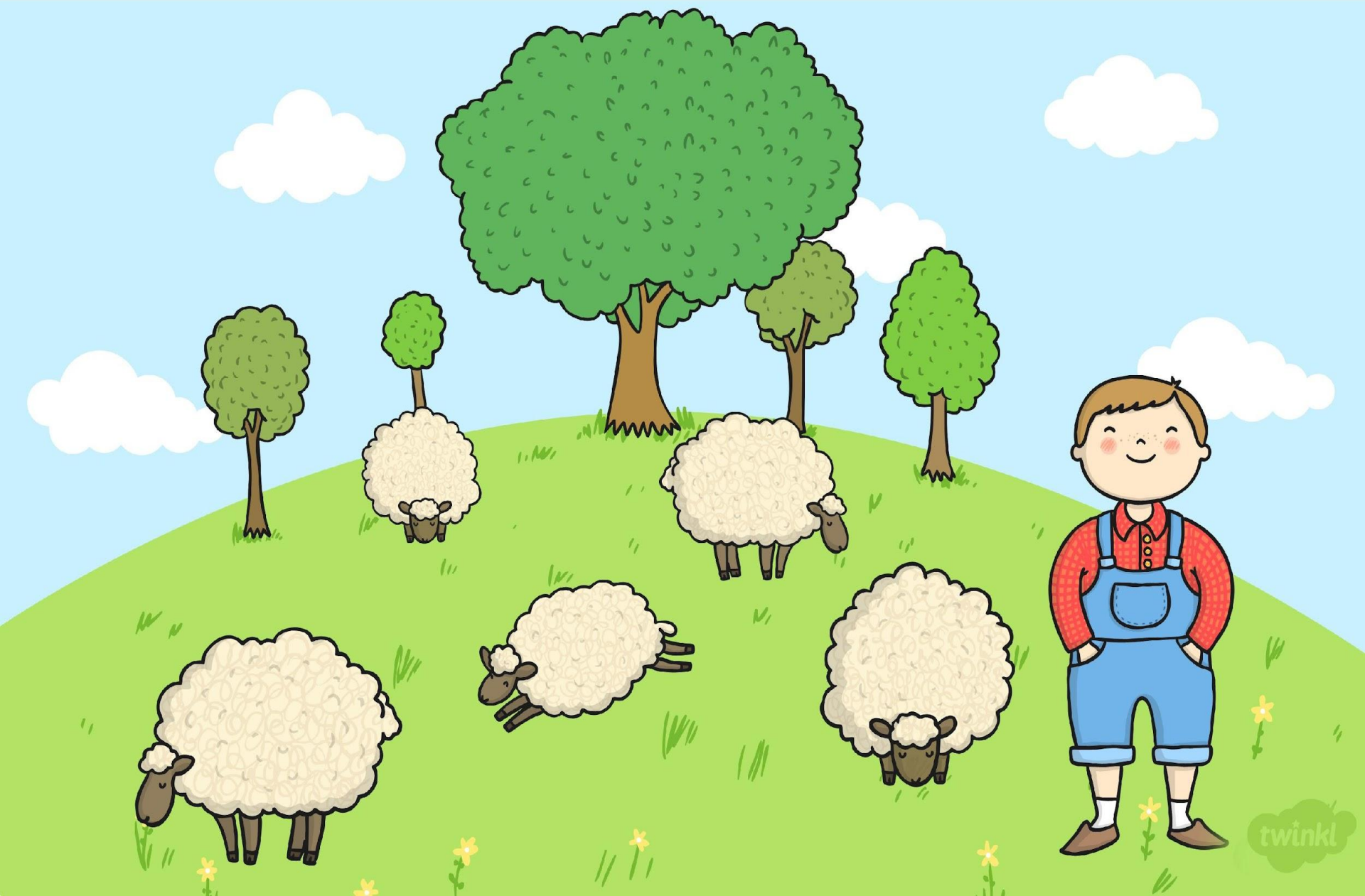
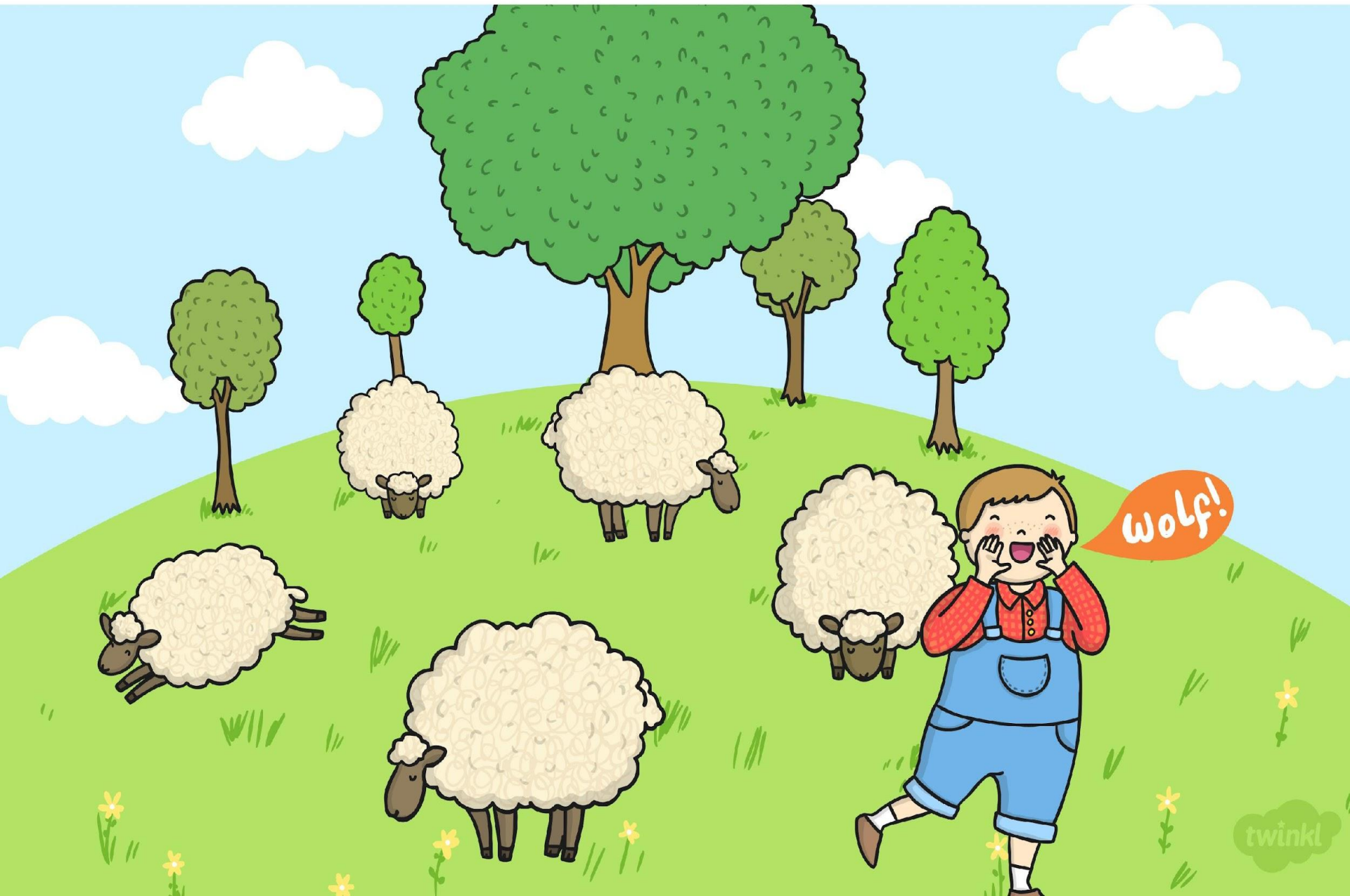

The boy was often bored so one day he decided to play a trick on the villagers to amuse himself. "Wolf! Wolf!" he cried at the top of his voice.



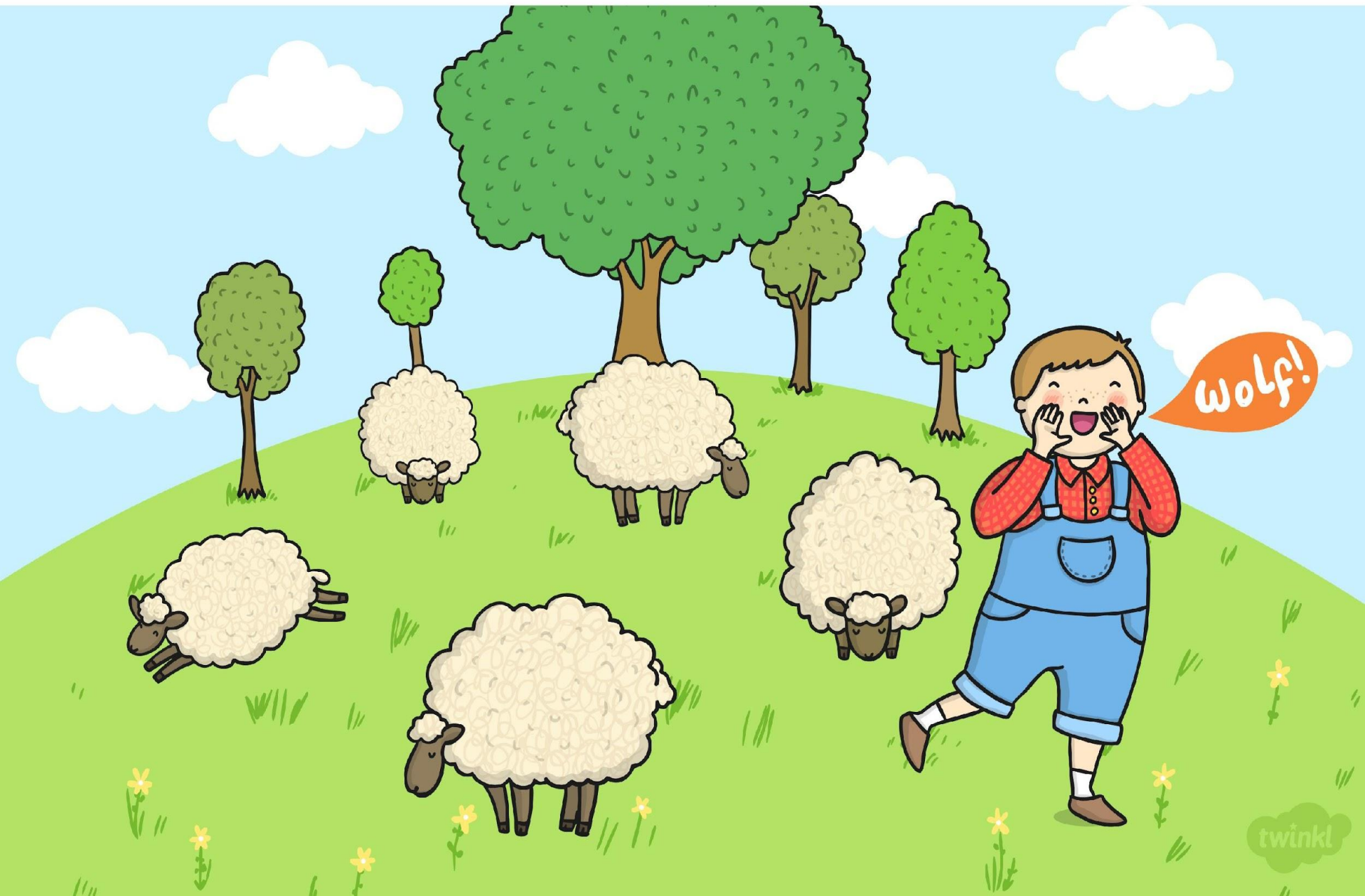
The villagers came rushing up the hill to save the sheep, but when they got there, there was no wolf to be seen and the boy laughed at them.



“You must not tell lies!” said the villagers angrily, and they went back down to the village.



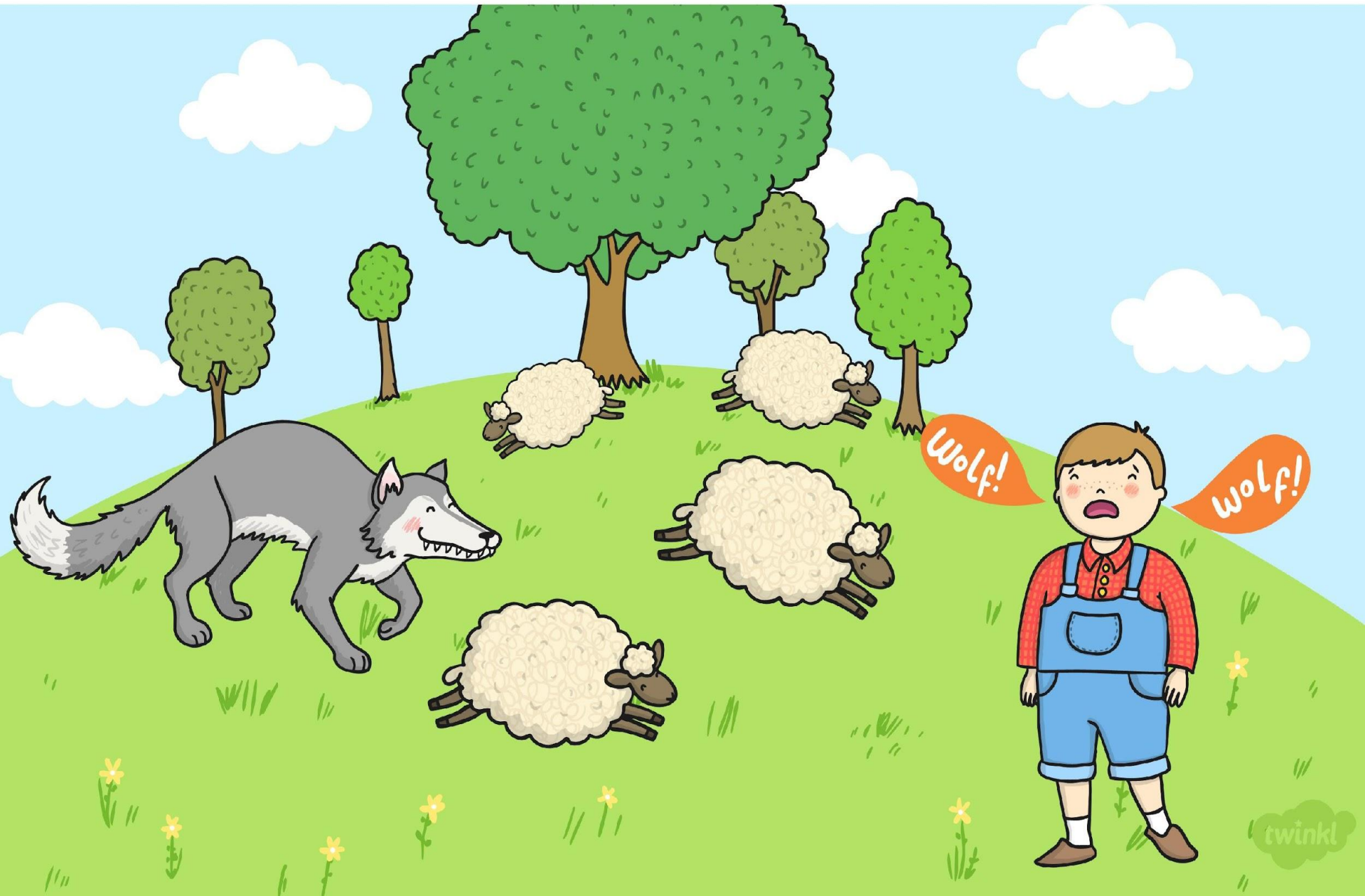
Soon the boy was bored again so he shouted “Wolf! Wolf!” and the villagers rushed up the hill to save the sheep.
