


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WHAT IS IT?

Steretype -- a person's pre-formed mental assessment c something, which can be reflected in the corresponding stereotypical behavior.

The concept of "stereotype" entered the socio-political Western discourse with the light hand of Walter Lippman, which he applied in describing his original concept of public opinion in 1922.





STEREOTYPE
