Aims of eco-socialism

- Collective ownership of means of production and distribution of goods and services
- Cooperation and communalism over competition. Harmony with environment
- Rejects authoritarian state and command economies of socialism's past
- The scale of governance differs: local producer and consumer cooperatives, bio-regionalism. Centralized coordinating body? A different globalization
- End of imperialism and warfare driven by capitalism
- End of subjugation of nature
- Freedom under socialism is two-pronged
 - Freedom over labor
 - Freedom as socialized wealth

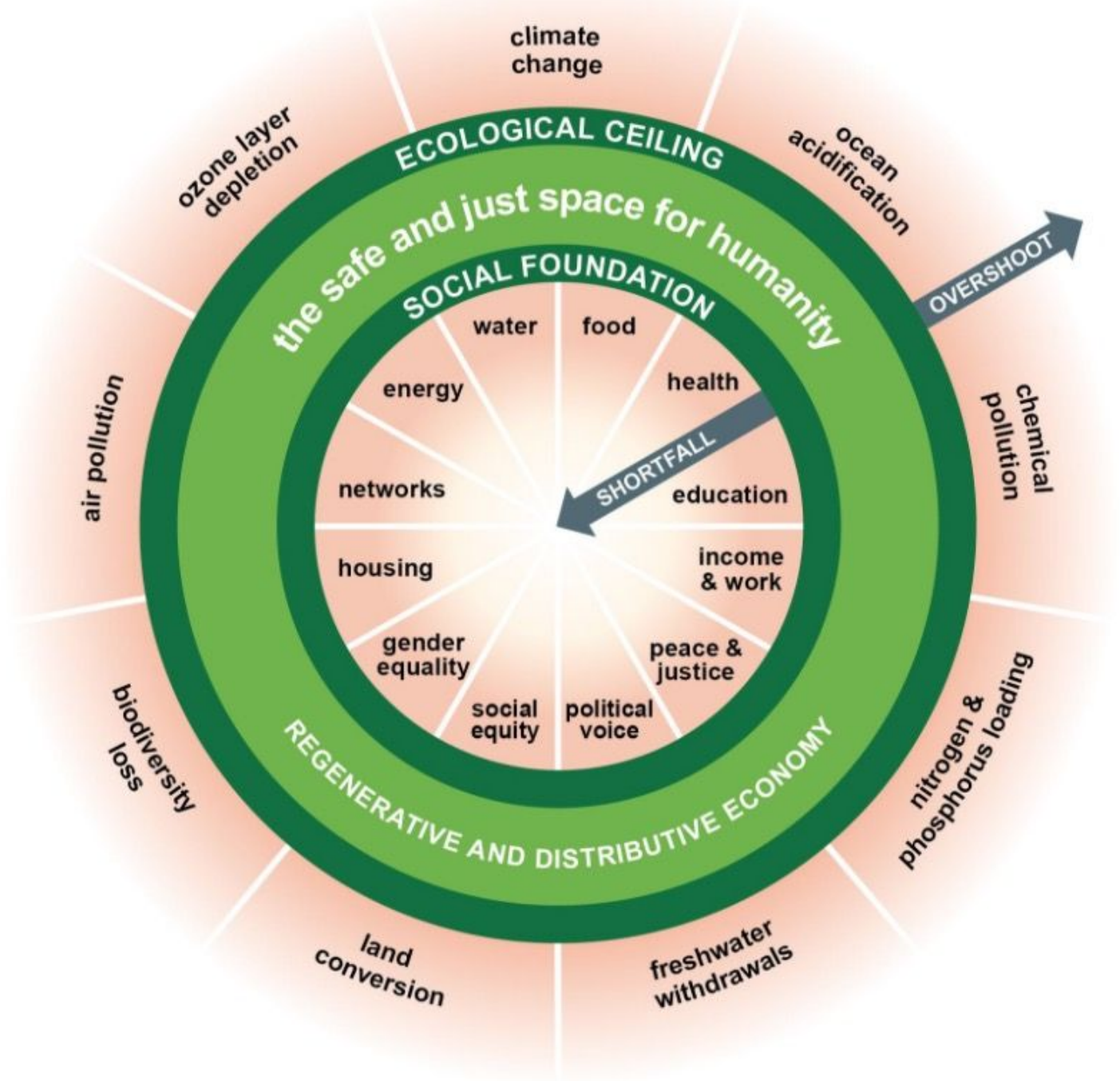
