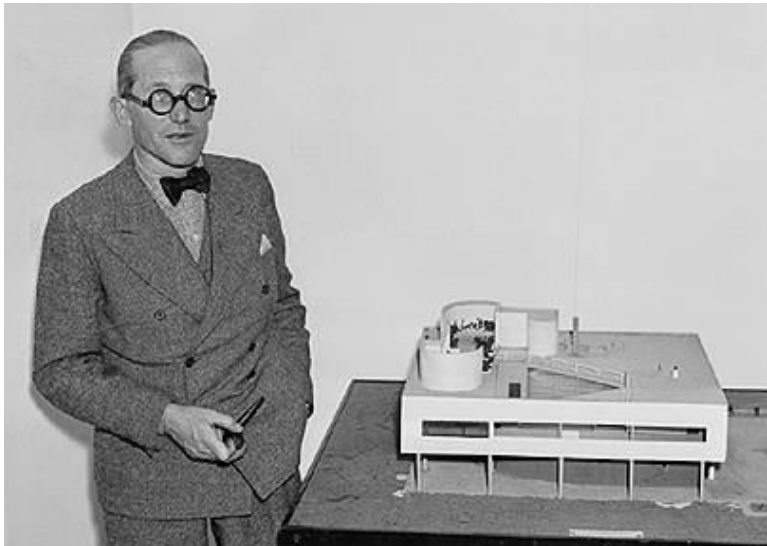

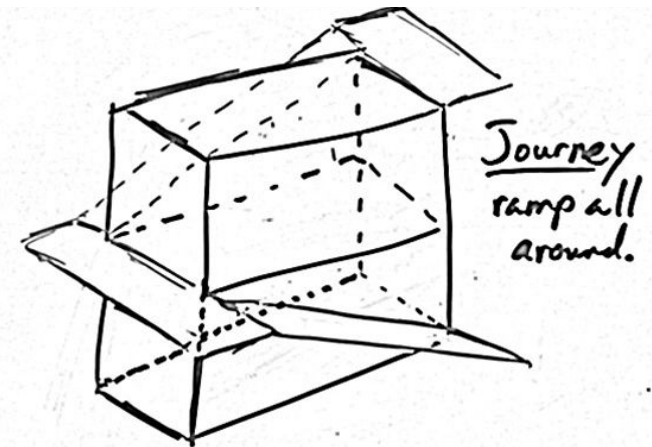
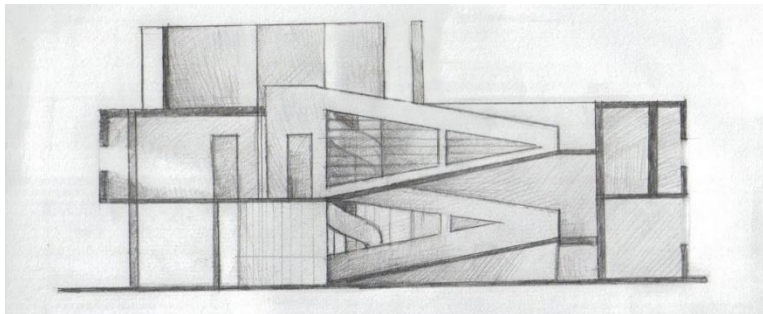

“A ramp provides a gradual ascent from the pilotis, creating totally different sensations than those felt when climbing stairs. A staircase separates one floor from another: a ramp links them together.” -Le Corbusier



Five Points of Architecture

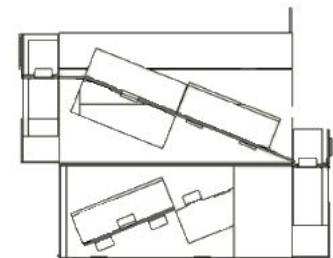
Pilotis, Functional Roof, Free Floor Plan, Ribbon Windows, Free Facade

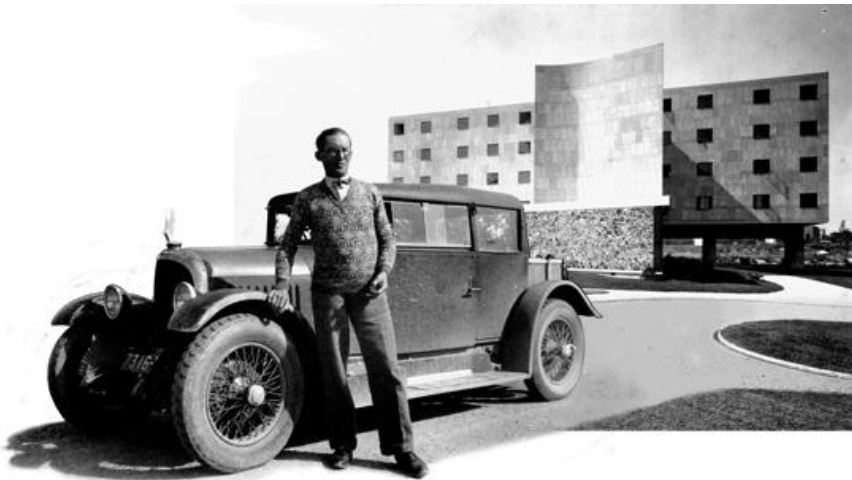


Our Model

Le Corbusier's "Lumineuse"

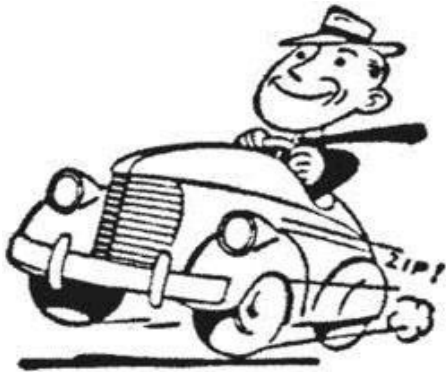


The Voiture Minimum

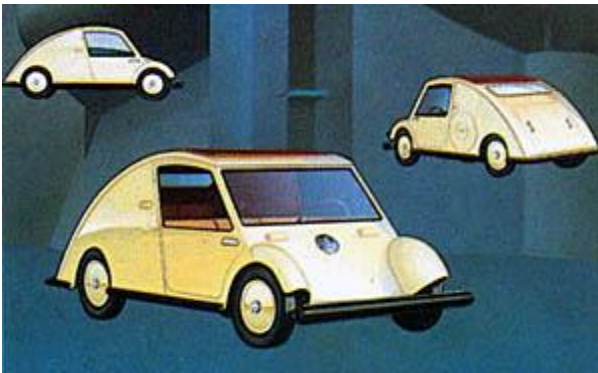

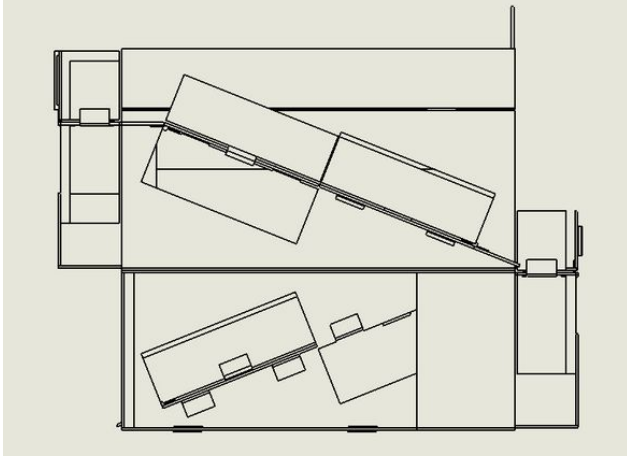

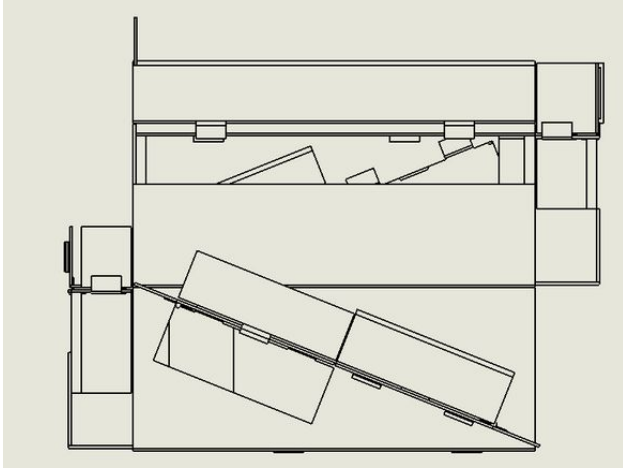
