Meaning

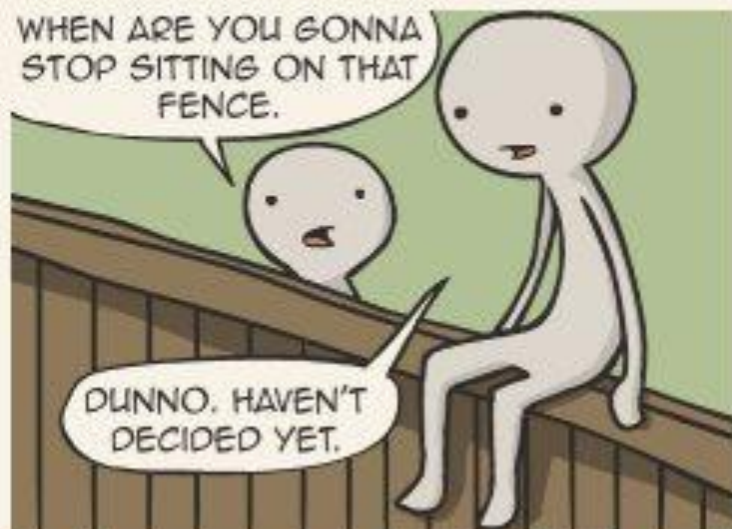
To delay making a decision when you have to choose between two sides.

sit on the fence

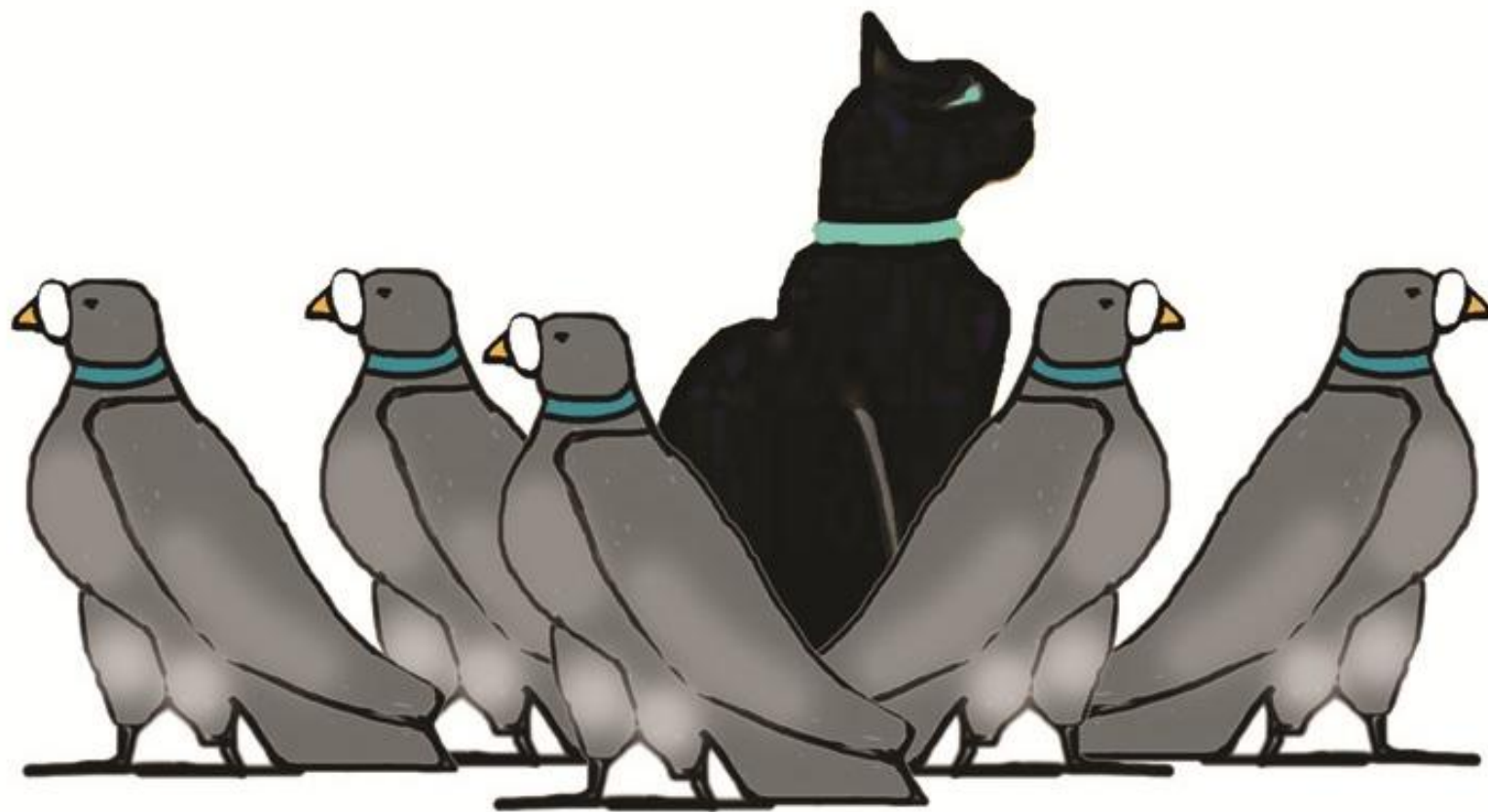


you can't decide what to do, or what is best

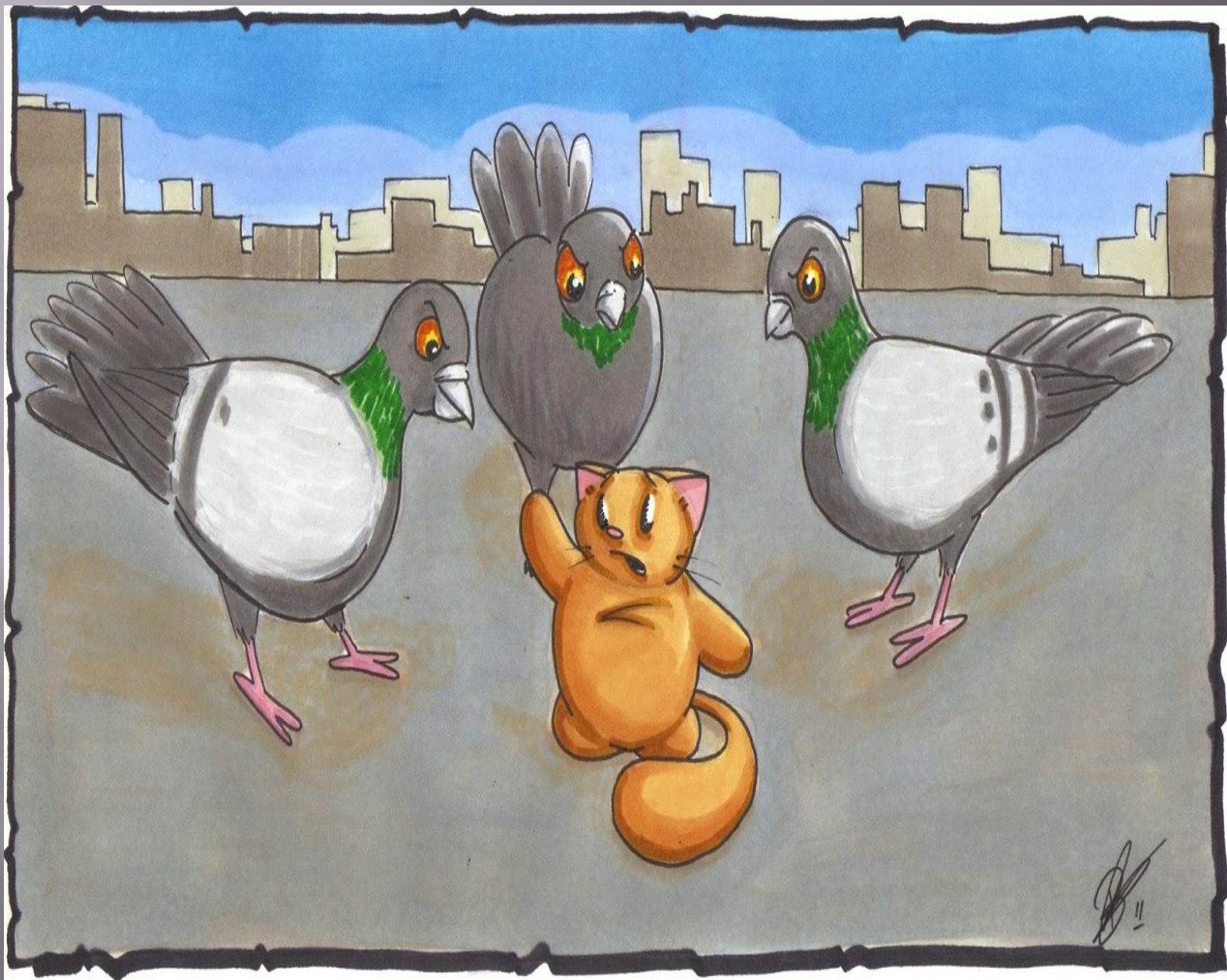
