When Jane and Tom argue, it's best to sit on the fence and not make either of them angry.

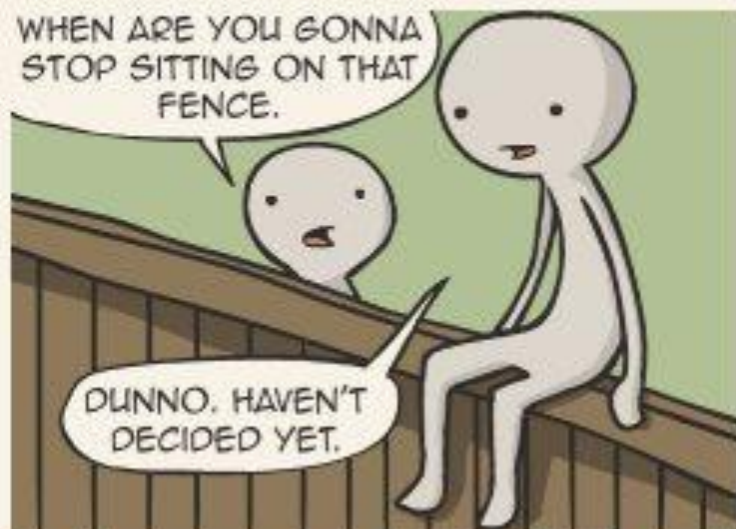

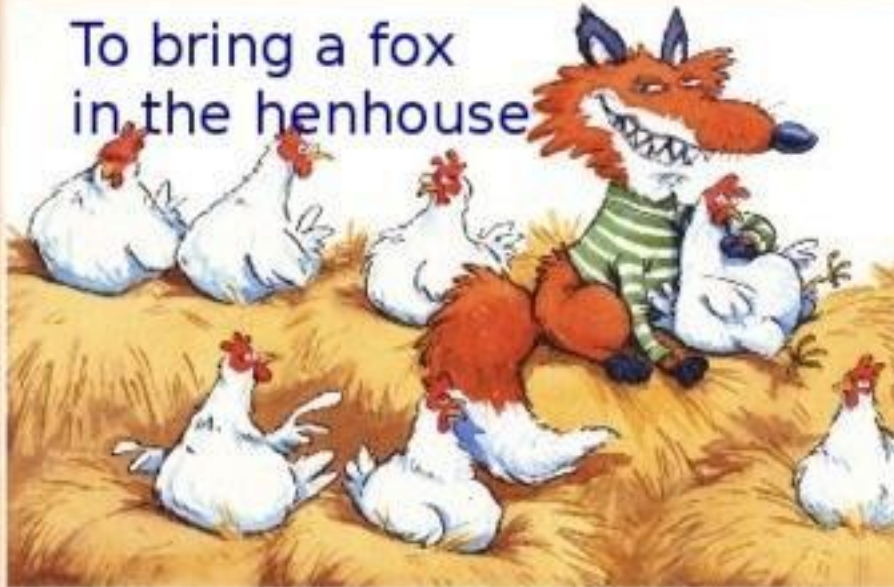

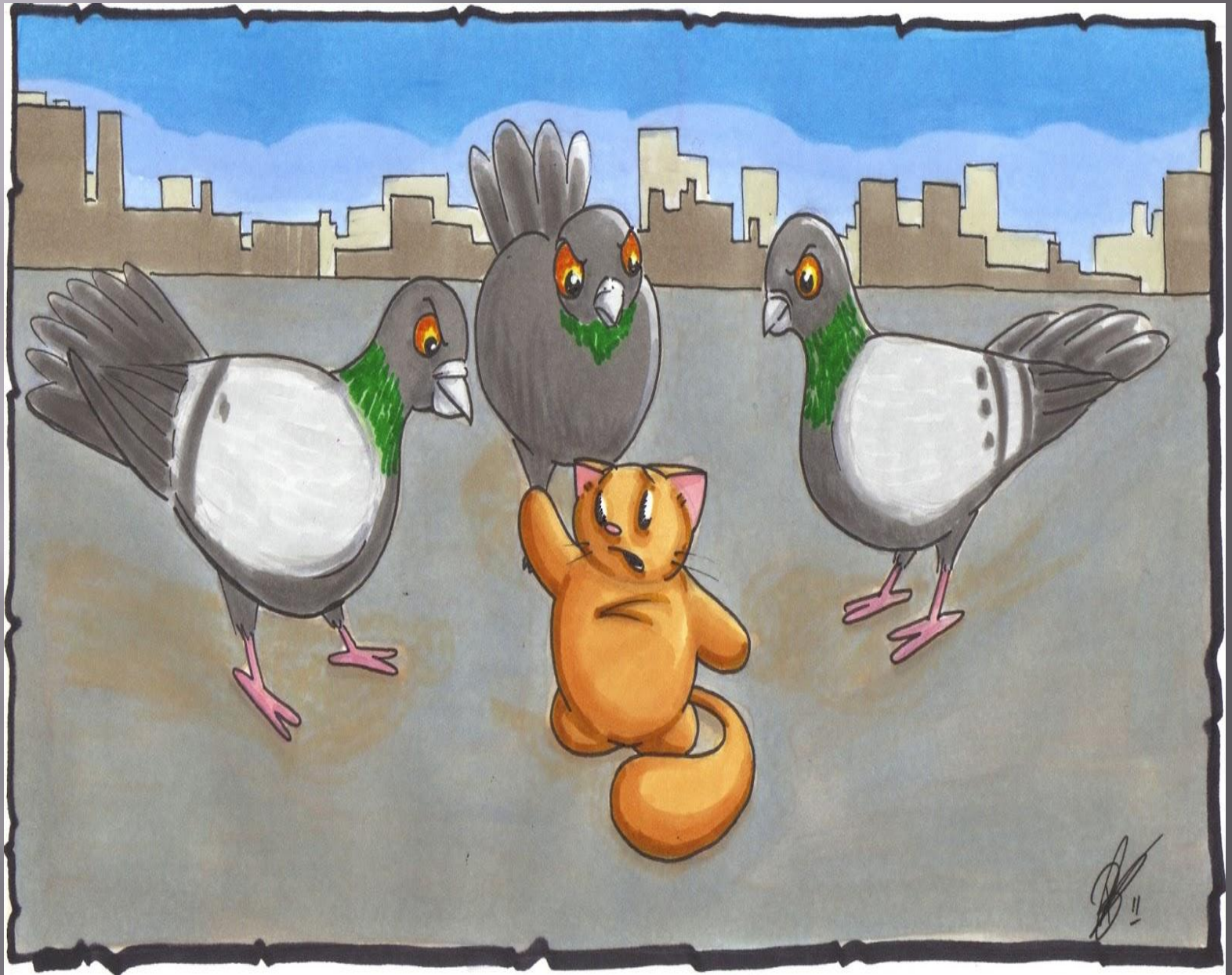
