Example sentence:

No, I didn't hear the storm outside – I was so tired that *I slept like a log* all night. (Also: I slept like a baby.)

# Sleep like a log

To sleep very deeply.

Everyone in our family sleeps like a log, so no one heard the thunderstorm in the middle of the night.



## I slept like a log last night. I woke up in the fireplace.
