

Most verbs takes -s in the third person singular. (He/ She/ It)

1 - ss, -sh, -ch, -x, -o → -es

I miss- he misses
I finish- he finishes
I watch- he watches
I mix- he mixes
I go- he goes

2 a consonant + y → -ies

I study - he studies
I cry- he cries

3 a vowel + y → -s

I play- he plays
