

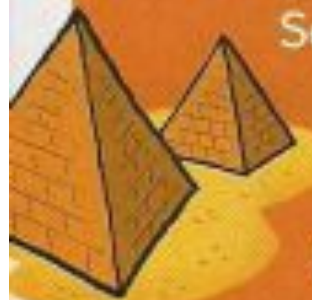

Captain Cook came from England. He was a great explorer and travelled to New Zealand and Australia.

Today people can go from Europe to New Zealand in twenty-four hours, but in the past, the voyage was long and dangerous. In 1769 James Cook sailed around New Zealand. Then he went to Australia. He met the Aborigines there and discovered the kangaroo. After that he went to the Antarctic and to the Pacific islands. He was the first European in lots of these places.

We know about Captain Cook's adventures from his diaries and his maps. Other people used Cook's maps and went to Australia and New Zealand after him. Today the Australians and New Zealanders all speak English.
