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Backlash over Blair's school revolution

City academy plans condemned by ex-education secretary Morris

An association of parents is warning that the creation of city academies could mean the end of the city schools system, with the possibility of a new type of school.

But the increasingly controversial plans for city academies, which would allow the former education secretary to set up academies, have been condemned by a group of parents.

In an article in *Education Week*, the former education secretary says that the plans for city academies are "a step towards a new type of school, one that could be the best of both worlds. In the past, when schools were run by local authorities, they were often too big to manage and too far from the children they served."

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UK link to terror snatches

Ежедневная газета в Великобритании, основана в Манчестере в 1821 году под названием *The Manchester Guardian*. В 1959 году сменила название на нынешнее, а в 1964 г. редакция переехала в Лондон. Воскресный выпуск оформлен в виде газеты *The Observer* (стала частью группы Guardian в 1993 г.). Сайт газеты — самый посещаемый из сайтов британских газет, причём его материалы могут отличаться от материалов бумажного издания.

По политическим взглядам издание относят к леволиберальным, считается, что редакция при этом состоит в достаточно близких отношениях с правящей Лейбористской партией.

12 сентября 2005 Британская газета "Гардиан" (The Guardian) перешла на уменьшенный формат - "берлинер". Газета стала на 6 сантиметров уже и на 12 - короче. Формат "берлинер" схож по внешнему виду с таблоидным форматом (А3), однако немного отличается от него по размерам. Изменился в новой версии "Гардиан" и шрифт материалов, и логотип. Новое начертание названия газеты сделано белыми буквами на фиолетовом фоне. По мнению экспертов по изучению британского медиа-рынка, "новый логотип стал более похожим по дизайну на логотипы интернет-изданий".

С 2006 года на уменьшенный формат перешли и издаваемый "Гардиан", и воскресный еженедельник The Observer.

- ▣ Учителя более 8 тысяч школ в Великобритании сегодня примут участие в национальной забастовке, направленной на повышение заработной платы. Как пишет газета The Guardian, место бастующих учителей придется занять директорам школ и практикантам. Как удалось подсчитать газете, каждая шестая школа в стране будет закрыта, треть школ просто не будут принимать учеников. Кроме того, в забастовке примут участие более 100 тыс. гражданских служащих, которые занимаются мониторингом школ или заняты в проведении школьных экзаменов, а также около 30 тыс. университетских лекторов.
