When he was young, he could climb trees. (general ability in the past)

• Разрешение Can/Could/May I use your phone? (asking for permission) You can take my car tonight. (giving permission) You can't take photographs inside the museum. (refusing permission)

• Просьба

Can you lend me your pen, please?
Could you open the door, please?
Will you post this letter?

• Предложение

We can/could watch a film tonight.

Shall we eat out tonight? (Why don't we eat/How about eating out tonight?)

• Возможность

He may/might/could be ill.

• Логическое предположение

She must be at work. (I'm sure she is ...)
She can't be at work. (I'm sure she isn't ...)

• Просьба

Shall I carry the shopping for you? (Would you like me to carry ...?)
