Must

To express necessity or obligation

Example:

You must leave now.



We use:



Mustn't

To express prohibition.

Example:

You mustn't go out of the bed.



We use: *Can* *Can't*



Examples:

She can swim very well.

Can I interrupt? – No you can't.

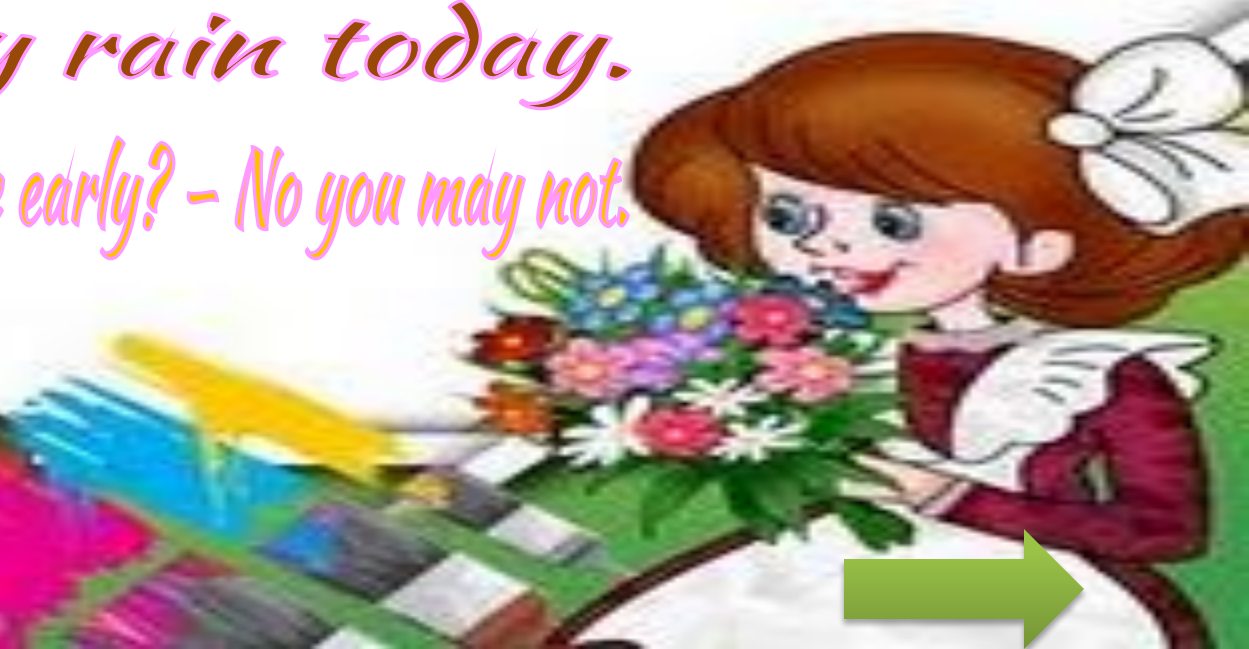
May
