Monologue

- is a long speech by one actor in a play or movie, or as part of a theatrical or broadcast program.



Monologue can be divided:

- 1. Introductory phrase
- 2. The first thesis (question)
- 3. Arguments to the first thesis (2-3)
- 4. The second thesis (question)
- 5. Arguments to the second thesis
- 6. Final phrase

When you talk alone, you should:

- 1. Speak loudly and confidently
- 2. Keep track of your gestures
- 3. Be brief
- 4. Don't be like a robot, be yourself!
- 5. Calm down and smile. (You can joke, if it's appropriate)

Some words are recommended:

- I'm going to give a talk about...
- Firstly, secondly, thirdly, finally,...
- Generally, admittedly, in fact, importantly,...
- In addition, moreover, furthermore,...
- Undoubtedly, indeed, surely, naturally, obviously,...
- Accordingly, consequently, because of this, as a result...
- That's all I wanted to say. Thank you for your attention.

Remember!

- You have to be brief. Do not talk too much and too long so that the public doesn't get bored;)
