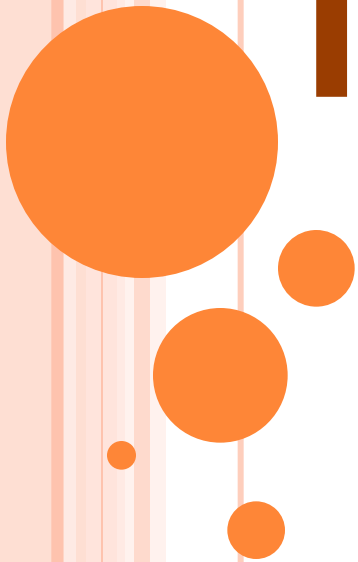


# PAST SIMPLE TENSE



- We use Past Simple Tense when we talk about completed actions in the past.



Example: I washed my car yesterday.

She ate pizza last night.



- Remember regular and irregular verbs.
- Turn regular verbs to the past by adding **-ed** or **-d**.

Regular Verb	Past Simple
walk	walk <b>ed</b>
want	want <b>ed</b>
help	help <b>ed</b>
decide	decid <b>ed</b>
agree	agre <b>ed</b>



## □ Affirmative sentences



Sally visited us last week.

I ran in the park.

## □ Negative sentences



Sally didn't visit us last week.

I didn't run in the park.



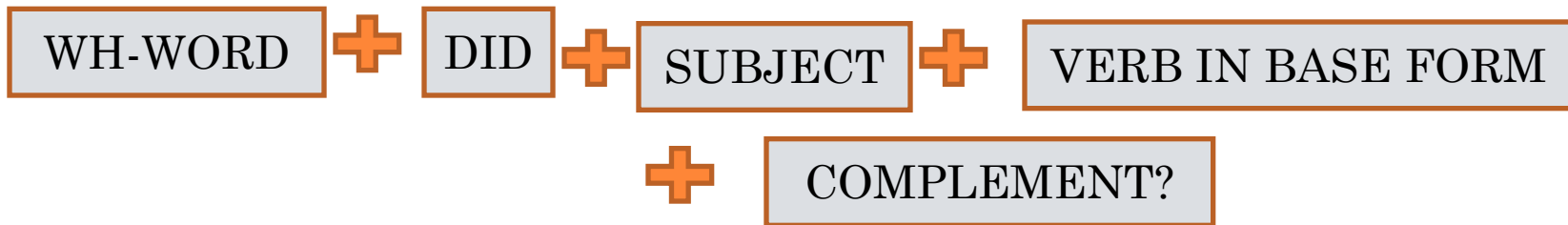
# KINDS OF QUESTIONS IN PAST SIMPLE

## □ Yes/No Questions



**Did** Tom visit you last week?

## □ Informative Questions



Where **did** you run last year?

WAS

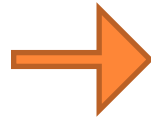
WERE

- Negative Sentences

Use the negative form or the contractions.

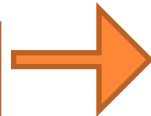
**Never** use **didn't**.

WAS NOT



WASN'T

WERE NOT



WERENT



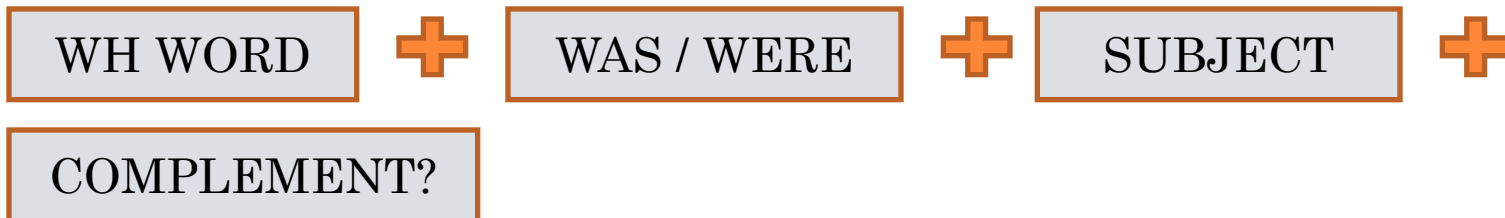
## □ Yes/No Questions
