## TENSE

$\square$ We use Past Simple Tense when we talk about completed actions in the past.

## Past <br> Present <br> Future

Example: I washed my car yesterd:

She ate pizza last nigh1

$\square$ Remember regular and irregular verbs.
Turn regular verbs to the past by adding -ed or -d.

| Regular Verb | Past Simple |
| :--- | :--- |
| walk | walked |
| want | wanted |
| help | helped |
| decide | decided |
| agree | agreed |

- Affirmative sentences


## SUBJECT

VERB IN PAST TENSE
COMPLEMENT

Sally visited us last week.
I ran in the park.

- Negative sentences


Sally didn't visit us last week.
I didn't run in the park.

## KINDS OF QUESTIONS IN PAST SIMPLE

- Yes/No Questions


Did Tom visit you last week?

- Informative Questions


Where did you run last year?

- Recall its past tense

> WAS

- Negative Sentences

Use the negative form or the contractions. Never use didn't.


Yes/No Questions
WAS / WERE
Was lrene in the house?
Were they at the Mall?

- Informative Questions

WH WORD WAS / WERE $\square$ SUBJECT
