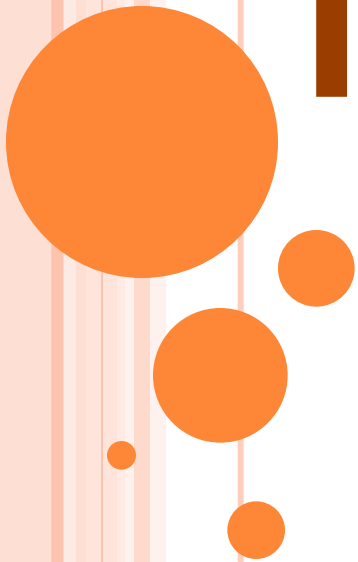


PAST SIMPLE TENSE



- We use Past Simple Tense when we talk about completed actions in the past.



Example: I washed my car yesterday.

She ate pizza last night.



- Remember regular and irregular verbs.
- Turn regular verbs to the past by adding **-ed** or **-d**.

Regular Verb	Past Simple
walk	walk ed
want	want ed
help	help ed
decide	decid ed
agree	agre ed



□ Affirmative sentences



Sally visited us last week.

I ran in the park.

□ Negative sentences



Sally didn't visit us last week.

I didn't run in the park.



KINDS OF QUESTIONS IN PAST SIMPLE

▣ Yes/No Questions



Did Tom visit you last week?

▣ Informative Questions



Where **did** you run last year?

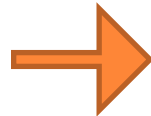
WERE

Use the negative form or the contractions.

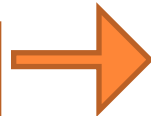
Never use **didn't**.
