
PAST SIMPLE TENSE

Turn regular verbs to the past by adding -ed or -d.

| Regular Verb | Past Simple |
|--------------|-----------------|
| walk | walk ed |
| want | want ed |
| help | help ed |
| decide | decid ed |
| agree | agre ed |


Sally **<u>visited</u>** us last week.




