

Hero Cities and Cities of Military Glory







Voronezh in Great Patriotic War



They defended Moscow and Leningrad, participated in the battles of Stalingrad and Kursk, liberated Warsaw and Prague, stormed Berlin. About 300 of Voronezh citizens were awarded for their heroism and bravery the title of Hero of the Soviet Union.
