Fires in the **fall!**

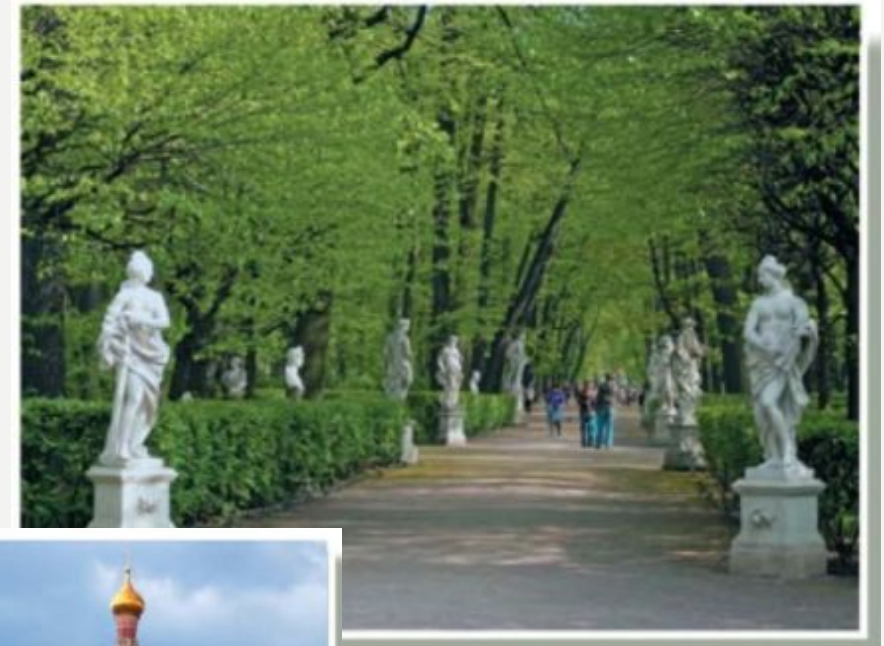
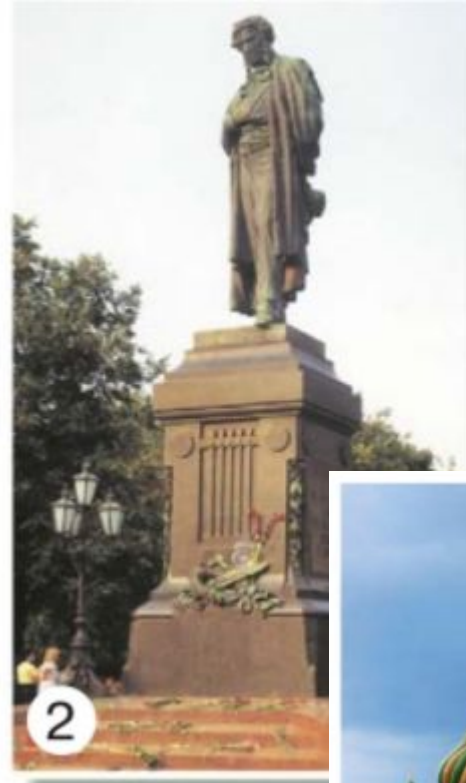

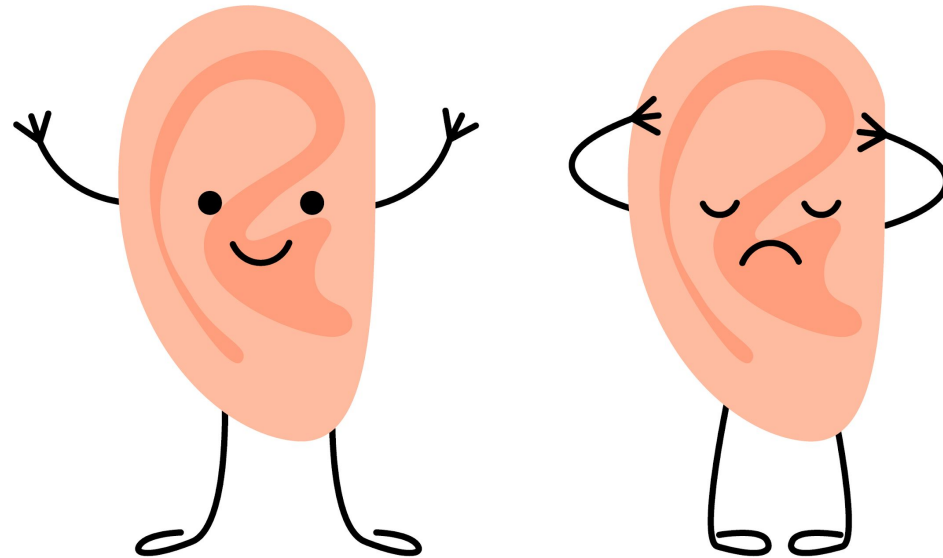
[¹'skʌlptʃə] at some of the stations. The Moscow Metro is one of the deepest and busiest metros in the world.

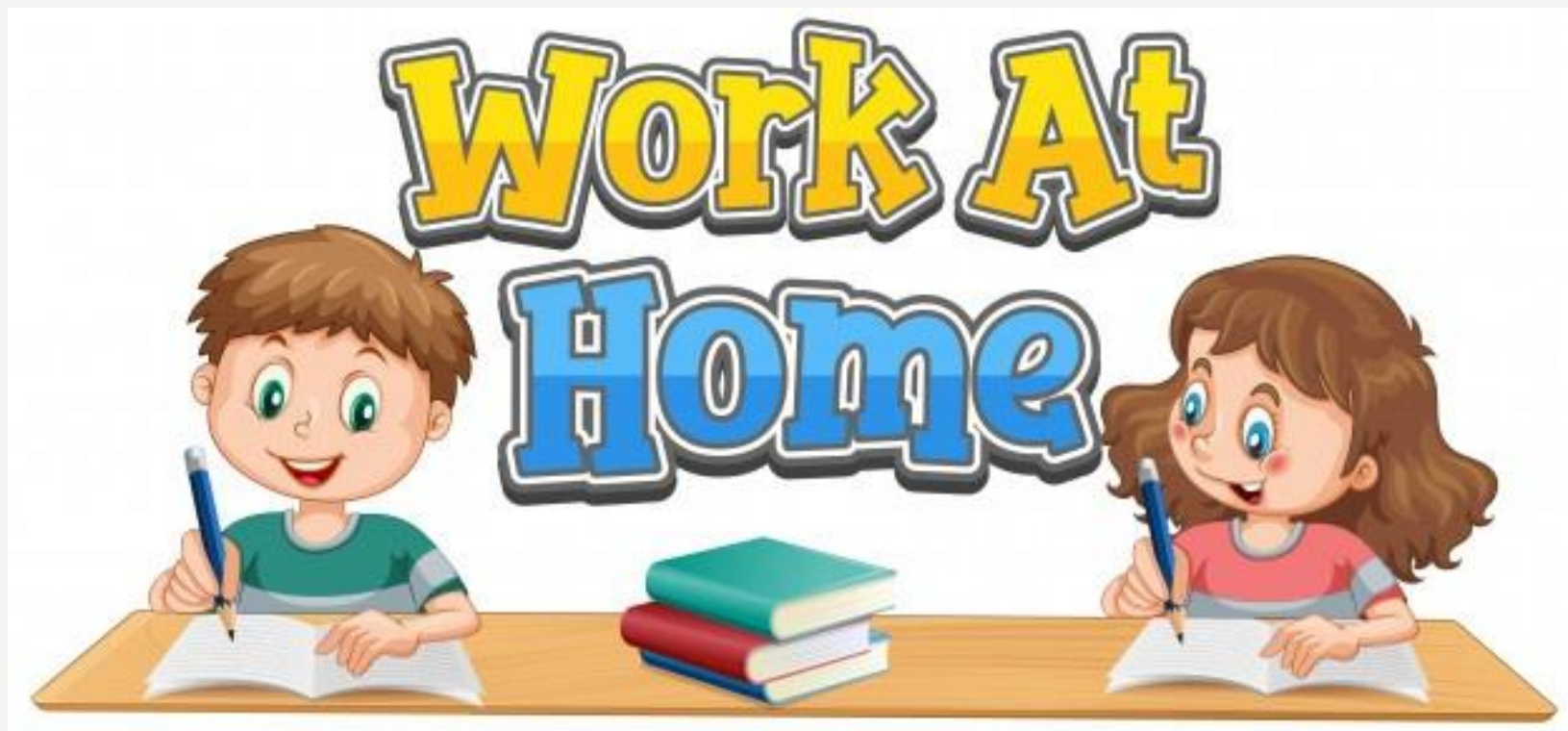
