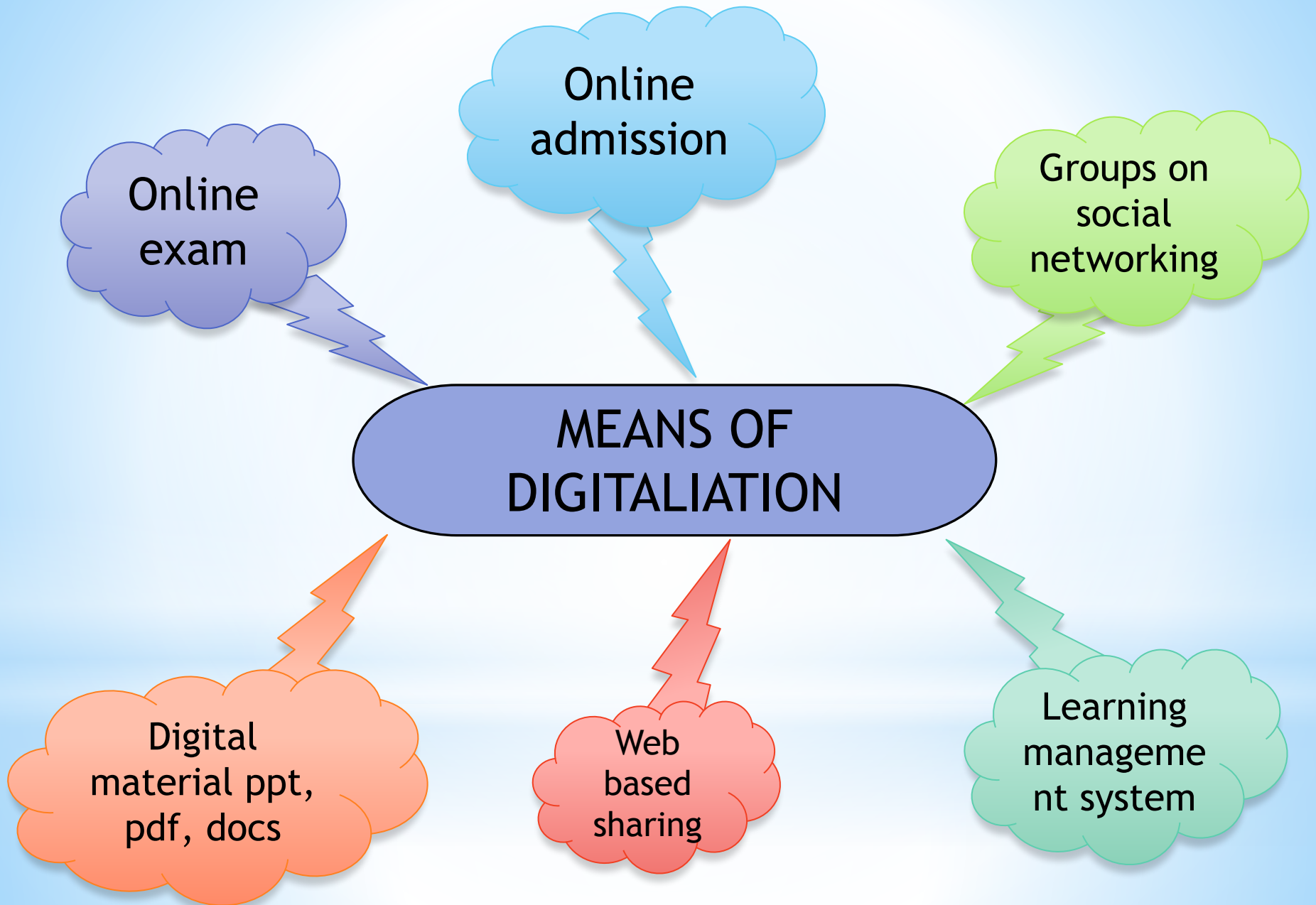
INTRODUCTION

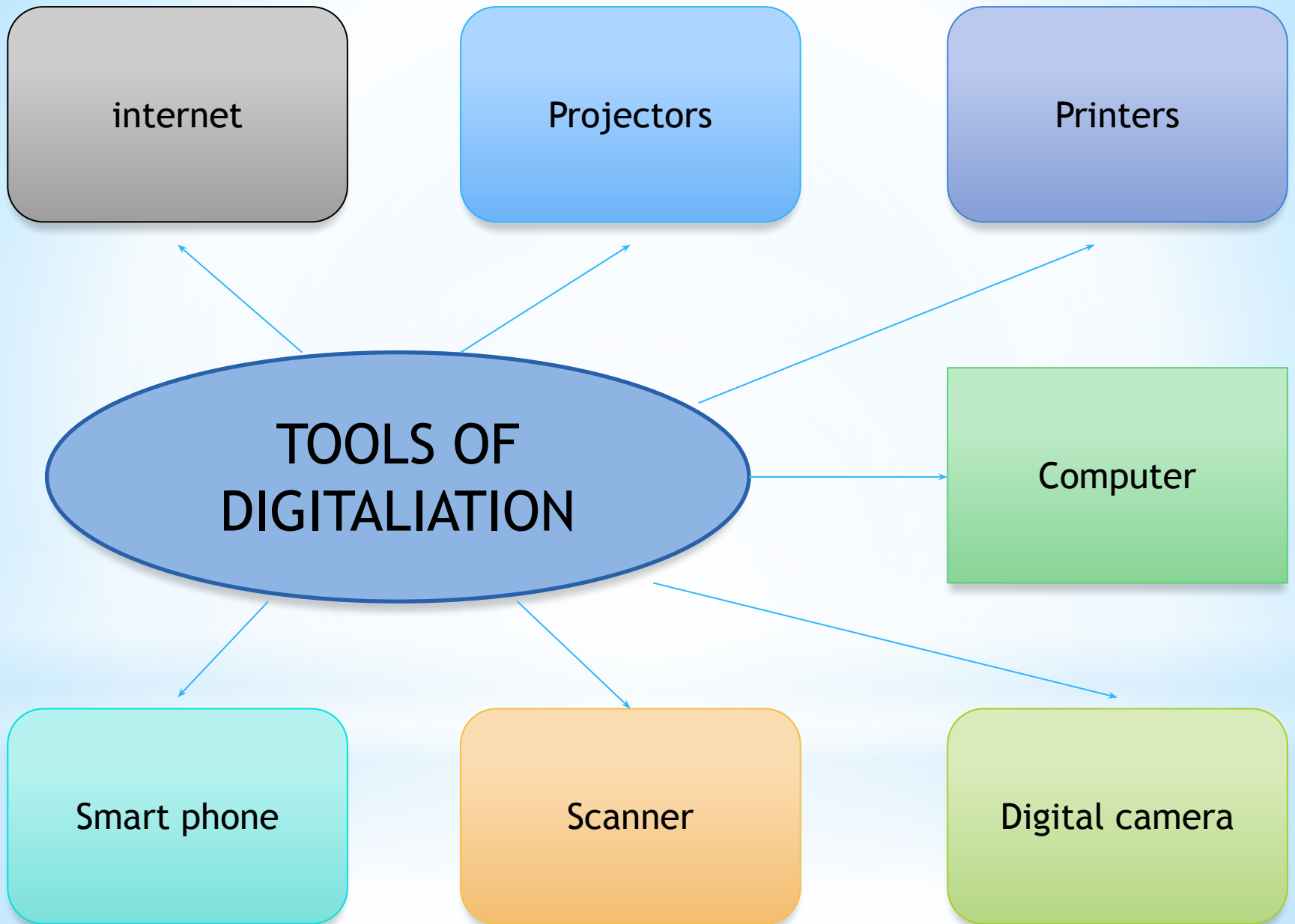
The modern formulation of schooling is fundamentally different from the old. Digitalization of education - this is what the process of transition to the electronic system is called.

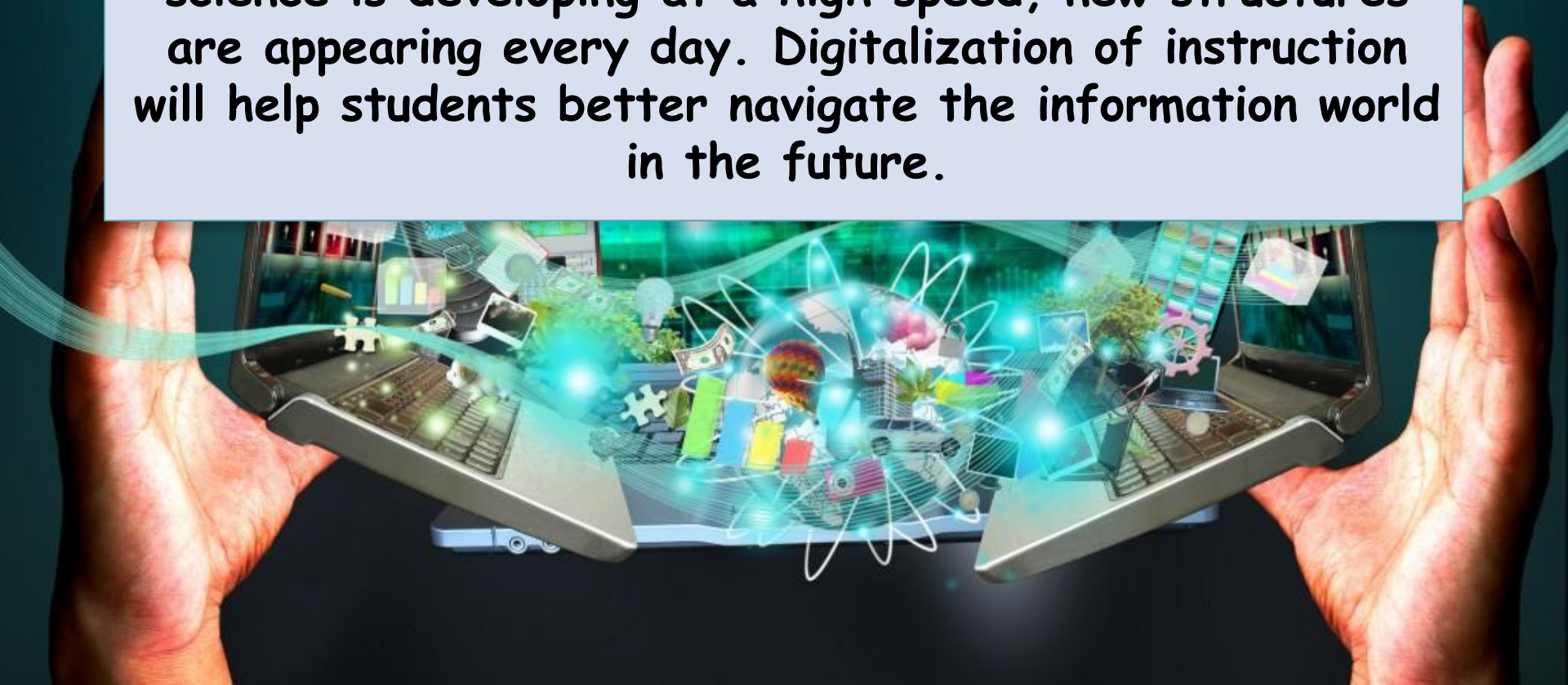
