What time are we leaving?

We are leaving in 20 minutes. We have to be there at 5 o'clock.



Prepositions show time, place, movement, and other relationships between words.

Prepositions of time include **at**, **in**, **on**.

What time are we leaving?

We are leaving **in** 20 minutes. We have to be there **at** 5 o'clock.





We need to be there **at**
5:00, so we should
leave **in** 10 minutes.
We want to be **on** time.

Prepositions show time.

Prepositions of time include **at, in, on.**

at	a specific time night	at 8:30 at night
-----------	--------------------------	-----------------------------------

Amy goes to school **at** 8:30.

We have choir practice **at** night.

Prepositions of time

in	a specific month	in February
	a specific year	in 1981
	the morning	in the morning
	the afternoon	in the afternoon
	the evening	in the evening

Valentine's Day is **in** February.

I earned my PhD **in** 1981.

We eat breakfast **in** the morning.

They got married **in** the afternoon.

The moon is out **in** the evening.

She has piano lessons **on** Monday.
Zoe's birthday is **on** December 30th.
