A post office is a public facility that provides mail services, including accepting of letters and parcels, providing post office boxes, and selling postage stamps, packaging, and stationery. Post offices may also offer additional services. These include providing and accepting government forms (such as passport applications), processing government services and fees (such as road tax), and postal savings or banking services (such as savings accounts and money orders). The chief administrator of a post office is called a postmaster. Russian Post employs about 390,000 people and has over 42,000 post offices, with its headquarters in Moscow. Russian Post owns 49.99% of the "Pochta Bank" (formerly Leto-Bank). In March 2019, Russian Post established sorting points in the UK and Finland to reduce delivery time of parcels from Western online stores to Russia.
