A creative approach allows to develop a unique program content and to involve teens with Judaism and Yiddiskeit, that are becoming active members of their local Jewish community day by day.

To increase acknowledgment in Jewish culture and traditions, the next directions of work are planned for the 2021:

Mentoring and consulting

- Regional supervisors trained to improve the professional qualifications of the coordinating team.
- Constant support for clubs in the process of program implementation.

YIDDISHKEIT FOR JEWISH TEENS

- 62 branches
- 56 cities
- 42 lessons in 1 branch per year
- About 2600 lessons in all clubs per year
- More than 40,000 visits by participants to all classes (in all clubs per year)
- 2,500 unique active members
- More than 35,000 visits to online events per year
