

ANOTHER - OTHER - THE OTHER

ANOTHER

- Used with singular countable nouns
- Means one more, an alternative

Examples:



- Can you manage **another** piece of cake?
- You wouldn't remember me. I was in **another** group.
- He tried his fortune in **another** city.

OTHER

- Used with plural or uncountable nouns.
- Means different, additional or extra.

Examples:



- Does life exist on **other** planets?
- We disputed with each **other** on various issues.
- I'm sorry, but I have **other** plans.



THE OTHER

- Used with singular nouns, plural nouns, countable or uncountable nouns.
- Means the second of two things, people, animals, or groups.

Examples:

- Sally is starting to play with **the other** children.
- While **the other** children played together, Ted ignored them.
- The grass is greener on **the other** side.

ANOTHER

ADJECTIVE / PRONOUN

= one more / an extra
an additional

= an alternative / a different

🌿 We have **another** book for you.

another + singular noun

🌿 We have **other** books for you.

other + plural noun



OTHER

ADJECTIVE / PRONOUN

= more in addition to the
one(s) already mentioned

= alternative / different

OTHERS

PRONOUN / NOUN

Replaces *other + plural noun*

Others is not followed by a noun.

others = *other people*

These shoes are too small.
