A 1) **Relax** (relax) and informal teaching style

American schools encourage students to think independently and take part in class discussions. The American 2) **education** (educate) system also offers a great range of subjects, so you could get the chance to study American history, journalism, business studies or drama. Some high schools offer 3) **driving** (drive) lessons too, so you could even get your American driving licence while you're in the USA!

School life
