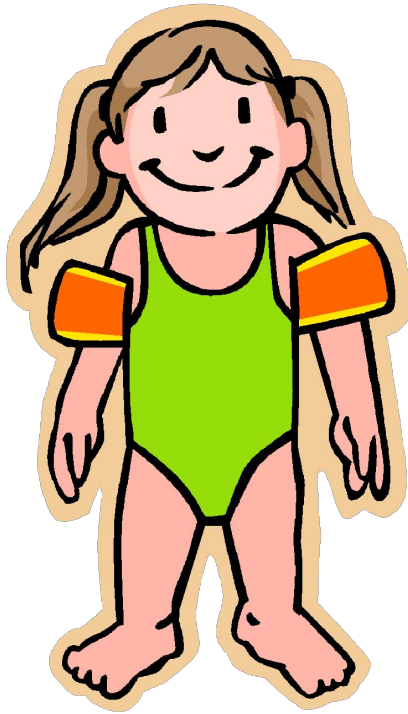


# Gerund or infinitive

I'm tired. I want \_\_\_\_\_ **to (go)** to bed.



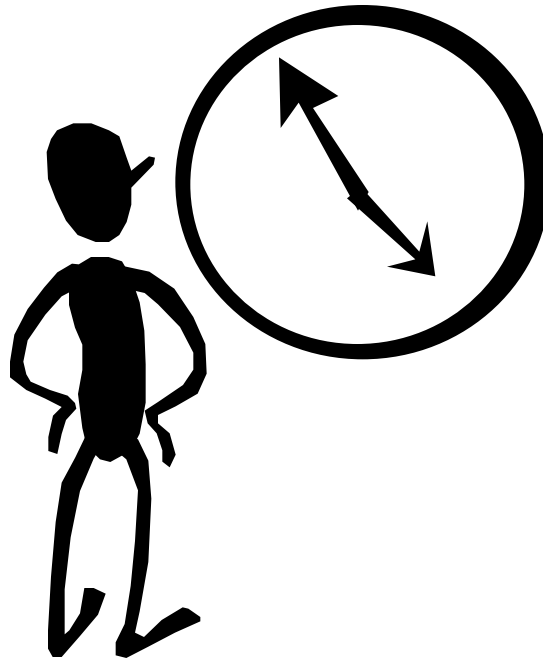
# Gerund or infinitive

We must avoid \_\_\_\_\_ ~~(to)~~ **being** late for the meeting.





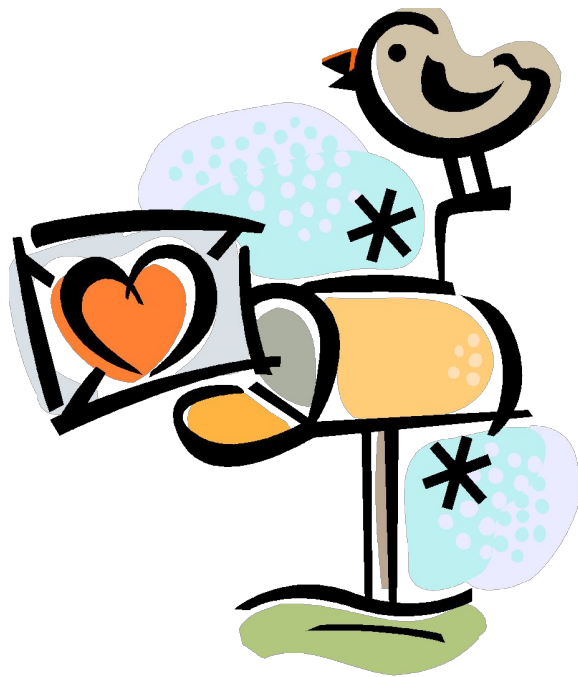
# Gerund or infinitive

**to take** part in the Olympics.



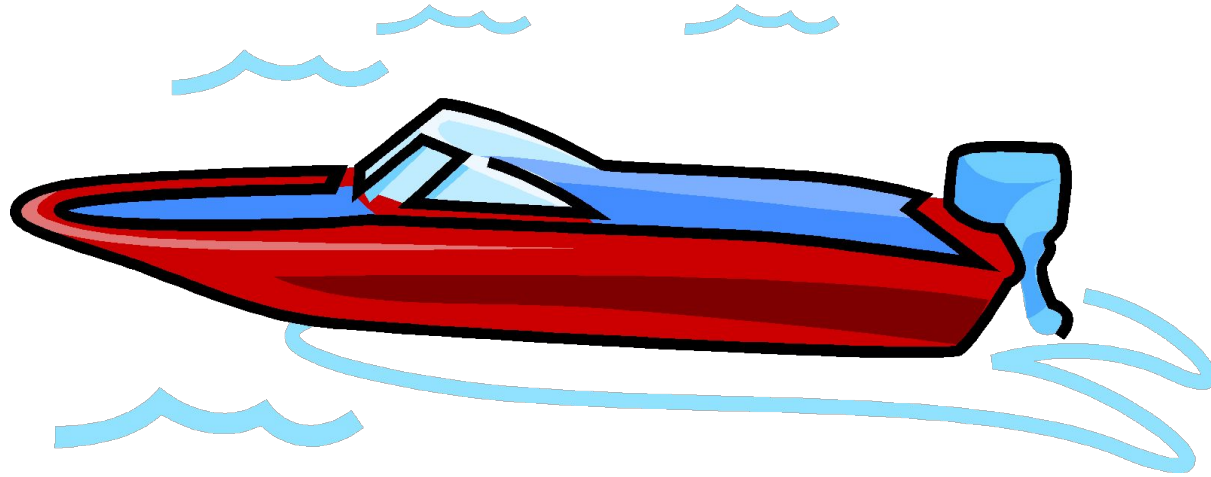
# Gerund or infinitive

to come (come)?



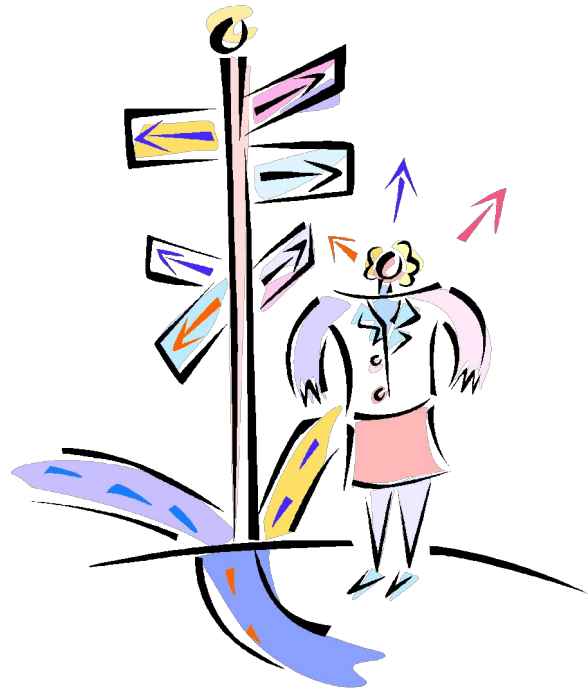
# Gerund or infinitive
