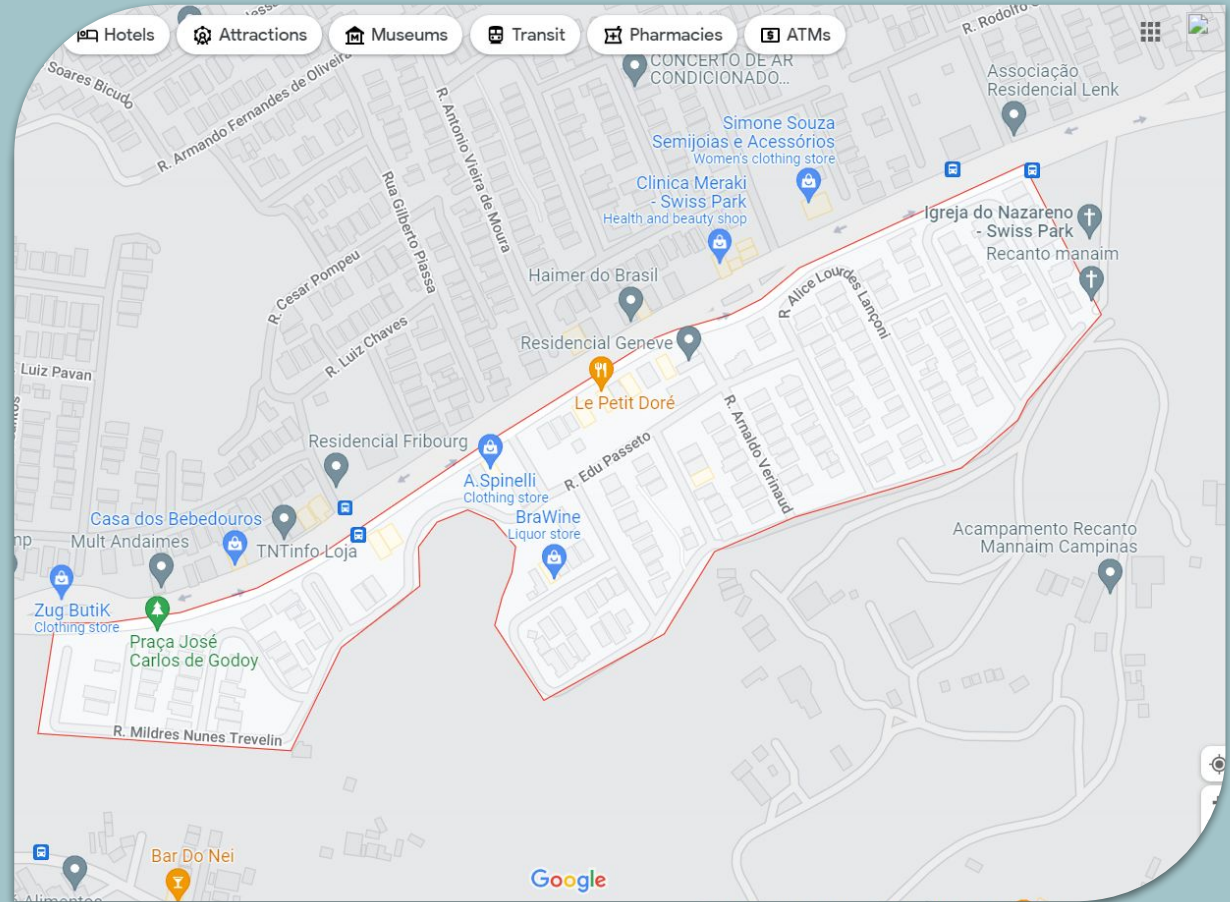

São Paulo is considered the most multicultural city in Brazil. From 1870 to 2010, approximately 2.3 million immigrants arrived in the state, from all parts of the world. The Italian community is one of the strongest, with a presence throughout the city. Of the 9 million inhabitants of São Paulo, 50% have full or partial Italian ancestry. São Paulo has more descendants of Italians than any Italian city.



Large hotel chains are in the city. São Paulo is home to 75% of the country's leading business fairs. The city also promotes one of the most important fashion weeks in the world, São Paulo Fashion Week, established in 1996 under the name Morumbi Fashion Brasil, is the largest and most important fashion event in Latin America. Besides, the São Paulo Gay Pride Parade, held since 1997 on Paulista Avenue is the event that attracts more tourists to the city.

The annual March For Jesus is a large gathering of Christians from Protestant churches throughout Brazil. In addition, São Paulo hosts the annual São Paulo Pancake Cook-Off in which chefs from across Brazil and the world participate in competitions based on the cooking of pancakes.

Cultural tourism also has relevance to the city, especially when considering the international events in the metropolis, such as the São Paulo Art Biennial.

The city has a nightlife that is considered one of the best in the country, and is an international hub of highly active and diverse nightlife with bars, dance bars and nightclubs staying open well past midnight. There are cinemas, theaters, museums, and cultural centers. The Rua Oscar Freire was named one of the eight most luxurious streets in the world, according to the Mystery Shopping International, and São Paulo the 25th "most expensive city" of the planet.

The top 7 foods to try in São Paulo

01 Picanha

If you've ever been to a Brazilian steakhouse you've probably heard of the rodizio style of service where servers bring you different cuts of meat on large skewers until you ask them to stop and you've probably seen picanha. The cut (called sirloin cap in the U.S.) has thick layer of charred fat that contrasts with the soft, rosy meat. This cut is so soft it'll fall apart in your mouth and, because of the fat, it's full of flavor.

02 Moqueca

This is the king of the Brazilian seafood dishes. Originally from Bahia, moqueca is a slow-cooked stew with fish, shrimp, and vegetables. The type of fish and shellfish used and the consistency of the stew changes depending on which restaurant you

dine at, some even use coconut milk to make it creamier. This dish is served hot, traditionally in a clay pot, as custom dictates.

04 Acai

they are usually mixed with other fruits, such as banana, mango, strawberry, and kiwi, with a granola topping. These sweet, cold, purple bowls are big enough for a full breakfast meal.

Acai is known worldwide as a superfood because of its richness in nutrients. The fruit is originally from Brazil and can be found in numerous dishes, from the popular bowls to juices, smoothies, sorbets, and fruit cocktails. Acai bowls are the most famous and

up to 20 hours. The final stew will have extremely soft meat and a thick broth. The recipe includes lean meat, different spices, onions, and tomatoes. It's served with farofa (a salty tapioca flour), rice and bananas.

Originally from southern Brazil, this dish mixes the Portuguese heritage with the traditions of the indigenous population of the zone. The authentic way to cook barreado is to dig a hole in the ground and put a clay pot in it so it cooks underground for

This is probably one of Brazil's most famous dishes. The feijoada is a rich, dense stew that mixes black beans and different cuts of pork in a pot and is cooked for a full 24 hours before serving. Although there are some restaurants that serve it

on a daily basis, this dish is usually served only on Wednesdays and Saturdays. Traditional feijoada uses pig trotters and ears, although some restaurants have a version that includes other parts of the pork.

06 Pão de Queijo

Who hasn't heard of these delicious cheese bread balls? Unlike some breads that have a cheese filling, the dough for Brazilian pão de queijo is prepared with cassava flour and minas cheese, creating these light and fluffy rolls. You'll find them

everywhere in Sao Paulo. They are sold as snacks, served on the breakfast buffet and as appetizers in many restaurants. Some places have variations that can include fillings like ham and others use pão de queijo for sandwiches.

07 Pastels

These pastries might look like something you may have tasted before, but their flavor is very different because of the dough and the fillings. These pastries were typically sold on street fairs, but they are now found in most restaurants

as appetizers. The dough is very light and crunchy, and the filling is always a surprise. They can be filled with ground meat, cheese, chicken, or vegetables (usually heart of palm).

São Paulo is considered a good shopping destination not only in Brazil, but in all of Latin America. This is where the world-famous brands H.Stern, Havainas and Melissa originated. There are 79 major shopping centres in São Paulo, including such chic malls as Cidade Jardim and Iguatemi.

What to buy in São Paulo

Brazil is known for its quality shoes. All models and styles are available on Avenida Paulista, which boasts some of the city's best shoe shops.

Boutiques of Brazilian designers such as Animale, Victor Dzenk, Ellus and Totem can be found on Rua Augusta and Alameda Lorena.

For those looking for something out of the ordinary, head to the shops in the Vila Madalena neighbourhood. Choose from vintage clothing, antiques and art work by Brazilian artists.

Bring home memorabilia made by local designers is a good idea. The D&D Decoracao & Design Center is a good place to pick up furniture and furnishings.

Sweet-tooth seekers should head to Clube Chocolate, a mall that offers designer clothes and a top-quality chocolate shop.
