





If I lose my passport, I'll go to the embassy.


## First Conditional

## First Conditional




Where will you go if you get sick?

# Examine The Sentence

It might happen.

● What tenses can you see?

present, future

● What connecting word can you see?

if

● What contraction can you see?

I will = I'll

● What punctuation can you see?

comma, full stop

## Affirmative Form

(If + present simple), (future)  
(future) (if + present simple)

## Question Form

\_\_\_\_\_ you do if you get lost?  
\_\_\_\_\_ you ask someone where you are if you get lost?

## Negative Form

If I \_\_\_\_\_ know where I am, I'll ask someone.  
If I get lost, I \_\_\_\_\_ panic.
