First Conditional





someone where I am.


First Conditional

me more.


First Conditional

If I lose my passport, I'll go to the embassy.


First Conditional

a friend's phone.

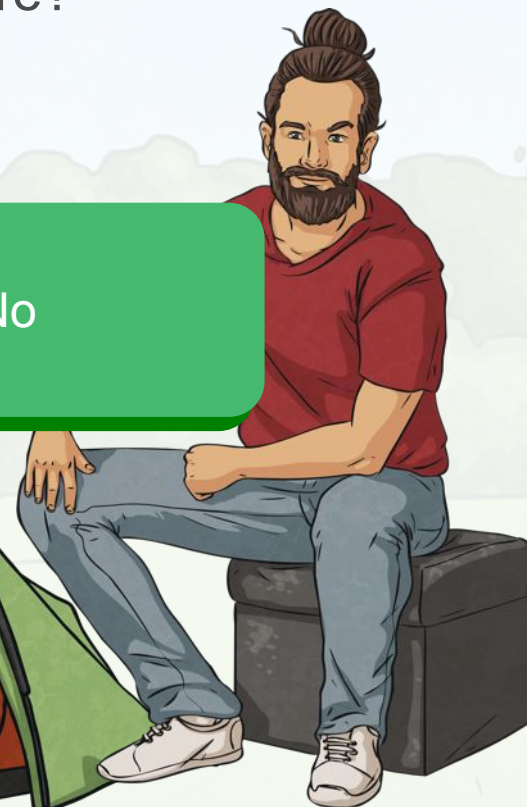
